Order Setting Schedule for Further Briefing of Cross-Motions for
Summary Judgment and Striking and Sealing Certain Current Filings

Both parties filed motions for summary judgment on the dispositive motion deadline. The court's February 22, 2016 order (Dkt. 32) set a schedule for the parties' anticipated cross-motions for summary judgment to foster efficient presentation of each party's arguments and to eliminate duplicative briefing as much as possible. The defendants' summary judgment filings on June 3 violate the February 22, 2016 order. To institute (again) the court's four-brief schedule for cross-motions for summary judgment, the court ORDERS:

1. The clerk is directed to STRIKE the motion for summary judgment, supporting materials, and brief filed by the defendants, at Dkts. 35, 36, 37, and 41.
2. By **July 1, 2016**, the defendants must file (a) its cross-motion for summary judgment, (b) *one* combined brief serving as its memorandum in support of its motion for summary judgment and as its opposition to the plaintiff's motion


for summary judgment, and (c) *one* set of exhibits that support its own motion and upon which it relies in opposing the plaintiff's motion.¹ The page limit for the combined brief is 50 pages.

3. Ms. Summers must file *one* combined brief serving as her opposition to the defendants' motion for summary judgment and her reply in support of her own motion for summary judgment. The combined opposition/reply brief must be filed by **July 29, 2016**. The page limit is 45 pages.

4. The defendants must file their reply brief in support of their motion for summary judgment by **August 12, 2016**. The page limit is 20 pages.
