MINUTE entry before the Honorable Jeffrey T. Gilbert: In response to telephone inquiries to chambers concerning the hearing on Plaintiffs' Motion for Preliminary Injunction [21] currently scheduled for 8/3/16 and the Court's preferred time allocations for oral argument at that hearing, the Court suggests the following allocations: Plaintiffs will take up to 30 minutes for an opening presentation; the Federal Defendants together, the District Defendants and Intervenor–Defendants will each take up to 20 minutes for any separate presentations; and Plaintiffs will take up to 20 minutes for any rebuttal. The Court does not need any party to regurgitate verbatim what they have said in their briefs. Rather, the Court encourages presentations that hit the high points, focus on or summarize the key facts or law upon which a party relies, and emphasize what a party believes to be the fundamental or key weakness(es) in an opponents position. The Court also will have some questions for the parties. If these proposed time allocations are not acceptable, then the parties should feel free to submit a letter to chambers with their alternative proposal(s). The Court continues to reserve the option to continue the 8/3/16 hearing as it mentioned at an earlier hearing if it believes that is necessary. Mailed notice(ber,)
