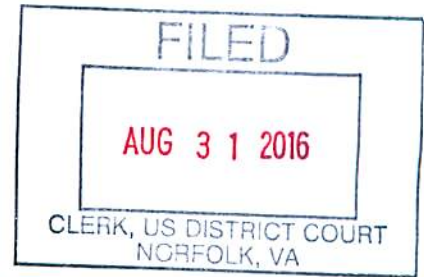

ORDER

This matter is before the Court on Defendant Gloucester County School Board's Unopposed Motion for Stay. ECF No. 80. With this Motion, the School Board asks this Court to stay this case pending disposition of its petition for a writ of certiorari with the United States Supreme Court. Br. in Supp. of Unopposed Mot. to Stay, ECF No. 81. On August 3, 2016, the Supreme Court recalled and stayed the mandate of the Fourth's Circuit's decision in No. 15-2056 and also stayed the preliminary injunction entered by this Court. Gloucester Cty. Sch Bd. v. G.G. v. ex rel. Grimm, No 16A52, 2016 WL 4131636 (U.S. Aug. 3, 2016). This stay by the Supreme Court will terminate automatically if the petition for certiorari is denied. If the petition is granted, the stay will terminate upon the issuance of judgment by the Supreme Court.


By recalling the mandate in No. 15-2056, the Supreme Court has taken away this Court's jurisdiction to hear plaintiff G.G.'s claim under Title IX. Although the Court could proceed with G.G.'s claim under equal protection, this would be an inefficient use of judicial resources as

many of the facts relevant to the two claims are shared. Additionally, G.G. does not oppose the instant motion. Accordingly, the Court hereby **GRANTS** the Motion to Stay and **STAYS** this matter pending the disposition of the School Board's petition for a writ of certiorari with the United States Supreme Court. ECF No. 80

The Clerk is **DIRECTED** to forward a copy of this Order to all Counsel of Record.
