**ORDER AND INFORMATION REGARDING
COURTHOUSE ACCESS, CELL PHONES, AND USE OF ELECTRONICS**

A. Access to the Courthouse/Prohibited Items

The Bryan Simpson United States Courthouse, located at 300 North Hogan Street, Jacksonville, Florida, opens to the public at 7:30 a.m. and the public must exit the building by 5:30 p.m. All persons entering the courthouse must show a government-issued picture ID, must pass through a security screening device, and must have any bags, packages, purses, etc., examined through an X-ray machine. Acceptable forms of identification include official state or United States government identification such as a driver's license or passport.

Members of the public are not permitted to bring cell phones, laptops, tablets, or other electronic equipment into the courthouse.¹ Weapons of any kind are prohibited. Proper decorum is expected of all visitors to the courthouse. The trial in this case will begin on

Monday, December 11, 2017 at 9:00 a.m. in Courtroom 10D and is expected to last for 3 days.

B. Use of Electronics by Members of the Press

The Administrative Order regarding Photography, Broadcasting, Television and Recording Equipment, Case No. 3:13-mc-38, is hereby waived and modified for the limited purpose of allowing any members of the press to enter the Courthouse for purposes of attending trial with a laptop computer or tablet (but not cell phones) by presenting the Court Security Officers with their media credentials and a copy of this Order. Live transmission of any kind from the courtroom while court is in session is strictly prohibited. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, texting, emailing, tweeting, blogging, and messaging or posting via any social media. In addition, no still photography and no audio or video recording is allowed in the courthouse at any time. Members of the press must abstain from interviewing any witnesses inside the courthouse.


C. Additional Persons Permitted to Bring Cell Phones or Electronics into the Courthouse
