**PLAINTIFFS' CONSENT MOTION TO SET EXTENDED BRIEFING SCHEDULE ON
DEFENDANTS' PENDING MOTIONS**

Plaintiffs hereby file this consent motion for an extension to respond to Defendants' motion for protective order and Defendants' motion to dissolve the preliminary injunction. In support thereof, Plaintiffs state as follows:

1. Defendants filed their motion for protective order on March 23, 2018. ECF No. 121.
2. Under the Local Rules, Plaintiffs' response to Defendants' motion for protective order is currently due by April 6, 2018.
3. Defendants filed their motion to dissolve the preliminary injunction on March 23, 2018. ECF No. 120.
4. Under the Local Rules, Plaintiffs' response to Defendants' motion to dissolve the preliminary injunction is currently due by April 6, 2018.
5. On March 23, 2018, the Secretary of Defense publicly issued a Memorandum for the President regarding Military Service by Transgender Individuals that was dated February 22, 2018. ECF No. 120-1.

6. On March 23, 2018, the Department of Defense publicly issued a Report and Recommendations on Military Service by Transgender Persons that was dated “February 2018.” ECF No. 120-2.
7. On March 23, 2018, the White House publicly issued a Memorandum for the Secretaries of Defense and Homeland Security regarding Military Service by Transgender Individuals. ECF No. 120-3.
8. Plaintiffs need additional time to respond to Defendants’ motion for protective order.
9. Plaintiffs need additional time to respond to Defendants’ motion to dissolve the preliminary injunction.
10. Defendants’ counsel has consented to the requested extensions and the parties have negotiated a proposed schedule.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs respectfully request that the Court enter an order directing Plaintiffs to file their opposition to Defendants’ motion for protective order by April 10, 2018; Defendants to file their reply in support of their motion for protective order by April 17, 2018; Plaintiffs to file their opposition to Defendants’ motion to dissolve the preliminary injunction by April 23, 2018; and Defendants to file their reply in support of their motion to dissolve the preliminary injunction by May 11, 2018.
