PLAINTIFFS’ MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

Pursuant to Local Rule 7, Plaintiffs respectfully request a 7-day extension of time, to and including Friday, May 11, 2018, within which to file their opposition to Defendants’ motions (ECF Nos. 115 & 116) to dissolve the preliminary injunction, to dismiss the complaint, and/or in the alternative for summary judgment. Plaintiffs have conferred with counsel for Defendants, who consent to this motion.

Good cause exists for an extension for the following reasons:

1. In support of their new motions to dismiss the second amended complaint and to dissolve the preliminary injunction, Defendants have filed two 45-page briefs that make, in some instances, significantly new and different arguments from those in their prior motion to dissolve the preliminary injunction (ECF No. 96). Additional time is necessary to respond to these new arguments.

2. In addition to these two motions, Defendants have moved, in the alternative, for summary judgment and have included a statement of material facts. As required by Local Rule 7(h)(1), Plaintiffs must respond to that statement by filing a separate statement. Additional time is necessary to formulate that response.

3. A short 7-day extension will not prejudice Defendants or unduly delay the expeditious resolution of the pending motions in this case.

For these reasons, Plaintiffs' motion for an extension should be granted. A proposed order is attached to this motion.
