- A Oh, okay.
- $\ensuremath{\mathtt{Q}}$   $\ensuremath{\mathtt{So}}$  did you attend any JONAH events or training sessions?
- A Yes. I went to two of them.
  - Q Can you tell us about that, briefly?
- A Yes. There were two trainings I went to for -for GUTS work, in order to help other people with, you
  know, releasing pent up emotions and -- and finding
  healing. So I went to both of those, and learned a lot
  of those processes.
- ${\tt Q}$   ${\tt How\ about\ Thaddeus\ Heffner.}$  Do you know him? A Yes.
  - Q Where did you meet him?
- A I staffed a couple of -- actually, the first time I met him was at Courage Sports Camp in 2011.
  - Q What's --
- A It's a Catholic organization that runs a retreat similar to JIM in some ways.
  - Q What's your impression of Mr. Heffner?
- A He's very -- very peaceful, very -- very kind, very loving. And I'm just -- every experience that I've had with him has been very positive.
- Q Based on your experience with these men, have you ever heard them refer to homosexuality as a mental disorder or mental disease?

## Schwab - Direct/Jonna

- A No, I've never heard them use that. I've heard them say the opposite, actually, yeah.
- Q By the way, have you ever heard the word disorder used in a religious context?
- A Yes. It's actually in the catechism of my church that homosexual behavior is an intrinsic disorder. And so I am -- that's the faith that I follow, and so that is my understanding of homosexuality.
- ${\tt Q} {\tt Have}$  you ever heard the defendants say they can cure homosexuality?
- A Never.
- Q I want to talk a little bit about your goals. Before you started this journey, how would you describe them?
- A Initially, my goals were just to find -initially, mostly sobriety because I was -- you know, I
  found myself addicted to either pornography or to
  acting out, or to a lot of emotional codependency in -in gay relationships. And I was almost kind of an
  agnostic at the time. I'd been away from my faith for
  a couple of years, and kind os just distanced from it,
  even though I was kind of longing for it.

But I sought out Dr. Nicolosi first because I knew that he had a very scientific approach to it and he was a licensed psychologist. And I knew that, based on

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what I had seen, with all the books I'd seen, and the people I've heard that have worked with him, I knew that if anybody could help me, he could.

And then from working with him, and seeing a lot of healing in a very short time, I became -- I came back into my faith because I realized that -- that the Church was right all along, that the teaching of the church was for my own benefit. It wasn't just an old rule or some kind of a stipulation. It was actually out of love and for my own benefit.

- How would you describe how your same sex attraction has changed since you started this journey? I'd the erotic same sex attraction and the romanticism has ben reduced by at least -- at least 90 percent in terms of frequency and intensity. be, you know, having lustful thoughts or acting out every day, sometimes several times a day, before I started this. And now it's more of like just a random thought, every couple weeks or so. And it doesn't compel me to -- to do anything that I don't want to do. It just -- it's a random thought, and I'm able to release that and analyze that.
- How about your opposite sex attraction? Q has that changed?
- I've definitely seen an -- an increase in that.

## Schwab - Direct/Jonna

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It's different from what I normally would have expected, in the past. It's not like a 180-degree shift because that wouldn't be healthy, either. Dr. Nicolosi explained to me early on, that typically for -- for men coming out of same sex attraction, the way that opposite sex attraction develops is they develop a friendship --

- I just want to hear about how your opposite sex attraction changed.
- The way my opposite sex attraction has Okay. changed is that when I have been able date a girl and get to know her, that I see that attraction develop as the friendship develops, and as the relationship develops. It's not the way some guys, where they look at -- see every girl as they walk by. And I don't necessarily see that as healthy, either. I don't want to objectify women either. I want to have a healthy marriage, eventually.
  - Are you happier now?
- Yes. Α
  - In which way?
- Α In every imaginable way. My life is a thousand

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- I met them both on a JIM weekend in 2007, the weekend I attended.
- And why did you attend that weekend? I attended that weekend because I also experience same sex attraction.
- How did you come to realize you experience same sex attraction?
- I came to realize this when I was about 12 years I had a lot of questions. And I remember some boys in middle school making fun of what they called And I remember walking away from that gay kids. experience and thinking I'm more like the gay kids they're making fun of.
- Can you tell us briefly about your childhood? Yeah. It was a good childhood. I come from a loving home, a great mom and dad, three brothers, one sister, and a really good family. The only downfall was early on, I had a pretty good falling out with my dad.
  - Why was that?
- I was with a girl and we were playing the "I'll show you mine if you show me yours" games, and that a lot of kids do play.
  - How old were you?
- I was four years old. About 50 percent of Α

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American apparently plays these games. And I know that now, but I didn't back then. And we were caught by the girl's mom. And the second we were caught, I was -- I knew I was in deep trouble. I knew I was in big trouble. I knew once my dad found out, I was going to get nailed for this, and that's exactly what happened.

That mom had called my mom. And then that day, when my dad got home from work, he called me into his bedroom and I'll never forget. He -- I walked that hallway and I go in the bedroom, and he was sitting on And he said -- he just pointed right here, come stand right over here. So I go and stand right there, just nervous and scared. And he just started yelling at me and started demanding answers, did you see her private parts, did you look at her, did you touch her. And I didn't. She was wearing these Oshkosh B'gosh overalls and I couldn't get them off. wanted to, but I couldn't get them off.

And it was -- that was horrible. It was very I'll never forget that moment. I felt like traumatic. something broke inside of me that day, like a disconnect happened between my dad and I.
