ORDER

This Order follows the parties' failure to agree on the date on which to have the hearing on the plaintiffs' motion for preliminary injunction and the defendants' and Equality Florida's motions to dismiss. The court previously provided the parties thirteen dates from which they could choose to schedule the hearing. (Doc. 88). Instead of submitting a joint notice advising the court which date they chose, the parties submitted separate notices that included hearing dates that worked for each party. (Doc. 90, 93). Neither notice included a date that worked for the opposing party. (*Id.*). Therefore, the court provides twelve additional dates below from which the parties can choose to schedule the hearing. The court advises the parties, however, that providing dates is a courtesy. If the parties fail to agree on one of the

twenty-five dates the court provided, then the court will select a date sua sponte.

Accordingly, it is **ORDERED** that:

1. By **July 18, 2018**, the parties must submit a joint notice advising the court which of the following dates they select for the hearing on the motion for preliminary injunction and motions to dismiss: October 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 9th, 10th, 22nd, 23rd, 24th, 25th, 26th, 29th, or 30th. The thirteen dates the court previously provided in the July 3rd Order also remain available. In the joint notice, the parties should list the date they agree on and advise the court how long each party expects the hearing to last. If the parties anticipate the hearing will take longer than one day, the parties must select as many days as they reasonably believe the hearing will last. The joint notice must not exceed two pages.
2. By **August 24, 2018**, the parties must submit a joint notice advising the court whether the hearing on the motion for preliminary injunction and motions to dismiss will be evidentiary or non-evidentiary. The joint notice must not exceed two pages.
