ORDER GRANTING IN PART AND DENYING IN PART  
JOINT MOTION OF ALL PARTIES TO MODIFY  
THE SEPTEMBER 17 SCHEDULING ORDER (ECF NO. 61)

The Court has received and considered the Joint Motion of all Parties to  
Modify the September 17 Scheduling Order. (ECF No. 61.) Although the parties

state in the motion that they are seeking “an adjustment of the case schedule by approximately 45 days,” they in fact propose new *Daubert* and dispositive motion deadlines that are 90 days beyond the current Scheduling Order dates. The Court will grant the motion in part, and will permit the parties to extend the current Scheduling Order dates by forty-five (45) days. The parties are free to reorder the expert disclosure deadlines as they choose but must limit the extension of any current Scheduling Order date to 45 days.

The Court stands ready to address requests for expedited discovery of materials, for example as to documents that the State Defendants allegedly cannot produce until two months from now.

The parties shall submit a revised proposed order conforming to this ruling. Uncooperative conduct in the discovery process will not be tolerated and no further extensions will be granted.
