**DEFENDANTS' CONSENT MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF
TIME TO FILE AN ANSWER**

Defendants hereby file this consent motion for an extension of time to file an Answer. In support thereof, Defendants state as follows:

1. On August 20, 2019, the Court granted in part and denied in part Defendants' Motion to Dismiss Plaintiffs' Second Amended Complaint or, in the Alternative, Defendants' Motion for Summary Judgment, ECF No. 158. ECF No. 264.

2. The Court further ordered that Defendants "file an Answer within fourteen (14) days of the date of this Order." ECF No. 264.

3. Given that Defendants' deadline to file an Answer fell after the Labor Day Holiday, Defendants filed a consent motion for a 14-day extension of time to file an Answer. ECF No. 265.

4. On August 27, 2019, this Court granted Defendants' consent motion for an extension of time to file an Answer. ECF No. 266.

5. Defendants' Answer is currently due September 17, 2019. ECF No. 266.

6. Plaintiffs informed Defendants that they intend to seek leave to amend their complaint.

7. Accordingly, Defendants request that the Court extend the time to file an Answer to 28 days from the Court's decision on Plaintiffs' motion for leave to amend their complaint.

8. Defendants have conferred with counsel for Plaintiffs, who consent to the relief requested herein.

WHEREFORE, Defendants respectfully request that the Court extend Defendants' time to file an Answer to 28 days from the Court's decision on Plaintiffs' motion for leave to amend their complaint. A proposed order accompanies this motion.
