ORDER

This matter is before the court on Plaintiffs-Appellants' Motion for Exemption from Electronic Filing (the "Motion"), which seeks an exemption from the court's electronic appendix requirement for certain audio files to be filed with the appellants' appendix. The audio files cannot be converted to a format acceptable for the court's electronic filing system. The Motion is unopposed by the appellees.

Upon consideration, the Motion is granted, as provided in this order. The appellants may file the audio files identified in the Motion as part of their appendix in hardcopy only. The audio files should be produced on CD or DVD, unless it is not possible to do so. Pursuant to Tenth Circuit Rule 30.3(A), two identical copies of the

CD/DVD(s) must be received in the Clerk's Office within two business days of the electronic filing of the opening brief and appendix. Each CD/DVD should be labeled clearly with our case number, the case name, the party submitting the materials, and a summary of the contents (e.g., audio files). And to assist the court's understanding of the breadth of materials in the appellants' appendix, the appellants should include page markers in the electronic and hardcopy versions of the appendix noting that audio files are being submitted to the court by conventional means.

Lastly, the appellants shall serve one hardcopy of the conventional portion of the appendix on all other parties to this appeal and reflect service in the certificate of service for the appendix.
