WRITTEN DECLARATION OF COVENANT WEDDINGS LLC, AN OHIO LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY

INTRODUCTION

This Written Declaration ("Agreement") of Covenant Weddings LLC, an Ohio limited liability company ("Company"), is entered into by and between the Company and Kristi M. Stokes, the sole member ("Member") to be effective on 5-26.

ARTICLE 1 - FORMATION

- 1.1 Name: The name of the Company is Covenant Weddings LLC. All business of Covenant Weddings LLC will be transacted in the Company's name.
- 1.2 Articles of Organization: The Company has been formed pursuant to Chapter 1705 of the Ohio Revised Code ("Act") by filing the Articles of Organization ("Articles") with the Ohio Secretary of State on May 20, 2020.
- 1.3 Statutory Agent: The Company's statutory agent for services and the statutory agent's address are designated in the Articles. The statutory agent may be changed by the Member as provided in Section 1705.06.
- 1.4 Principal Place of Business: The Company's principal place of business is designated in the Articles.

ARTICLE 2 - BUSINESS OF COMPANY

- 2.1 Business Purpose: The purpose of the Company is to carry on any lawful business or activity which may be conducted by a limited liability company organized under the Act.
- 2.2 Additional Purpose: The Company is a for-profit limited liability company that specializes in wedding services, which include officiating wedding ceremonies, drafting custom homilies, vows, and prayers, and assisting with other details associated with wedding ceremonies and related events. The Company is owned solely by the Member, who is a Christian minister who operates this business in accordance with her religious beliefs as a means of pursuing her spiritual calling to share her faith, celebrate marriage, and glorify God.
- 2.3 Beliefs, Purposes, and Practices: The Company affirms the following beliefs, purposes, and practices:
 - a) The Member believes that she must live her life consistent with her faith and seek to glorify God in everything she does, including her business. To do so, the Owner tries to operate the Company and make business decisions consistent with biblical principles. Specifically, the Company seeks to love God, love its neighbor, and share God's truth and beauty in what it does, says, and celebrates.
 - b) The Member believes that she is personally called to Christian ministry.

- c) As a Christian minister, the Member believes that God has called her to use her ordination and creative writing gifts as a ministry to officiate weddings and publicly celebrate the gift of marriage. The Member sees every wedding ceremony that she officiates and writes about as an opportunity for private and public ministry. The Member pursues these opportunities through her meetings with clients, the homilies and vows she drafts for their ceremony, her public statements about their ceremony, and in her public conduct in officiating their ceremony.
- d) The Member also believes that God created the institution of marriage as a permanent, monogamous, covenantal union between one man and one woman to achieve His purposes for humanity and to reflect the love of Jesus Christ for His Church. The Member is committed to using her talents, ordination, and creative writing passion to promote and celebrate this vision of marriage and to encourage others to pursue and value this vision of marriage.
- e) To stay true to these beliefs, the Member will only officiate ceremonies and create and publish celebratory messages (such as homilies and vows) that are consistent with her religious beliefs. Based on these convictions, the Company will not officiate ceremonies, produce texts for homilies, vows, or prayers, or otherwise promote ceremonies that violate the Member's religious beliefs or devalue her beliefs about marriage—such as ceremonies or texts that celebrate open marriages, temporary marriages, polyamorous relationships, same-sex marriages, or marriages between individuals who identify contrary to their biological sex.
- f) The Member will operate the Company according to her religious beliefs no matter how this policy affects her Company's profits.

ARTICLE 3 – MEMBER, CONTRIBUTION, AND MANAGEMENT

<u>3.1 Members</u>: The names of each initial Member, their capital contributions, and percentage interests are as follows:

3.2 Management: The Company shall be managed by the Member, who may act on behalf of the Company with or without a meeting and regardless of any financial interest the Member may have in such action. All decisions concerning the business affairs of the Company shall be made by the Member. Subject to the Act, the Articles, and this Agreement, the Member shall have authority to do every act consistent with the law. Actions by the Member shall bind the Company if such action is apparently carrying on in the usual way the business or affairs of the Company. The Member shall have all powers and duties as set forth in Chapter 1705 of the Ohio Revised Code. No person shall have any duty or obligation to inquire into the authority or power of the Member regarding the Member's actions on behalf of the Company. The failure of the Company to observe any

formalities or requirements relating to the exercise of its powers or the management of its business or affairs under this Agreement or the Act shall not be grounds for imposing liability on the Member for liabilities, debts and obligations of the Company solely for being the sole Member of the Company.

- 3.3 Member Liability and Indemnification: Except as otherwise provided by law, the Articles, or this Agreement, the Member shall have no personal liability, solely as a member, for any liabilities, obligations or losses of the Company beyond the Member's contributions. The Company shall indemnify the Member for all costs, expenses, losses, liabilities, obligations, and damages paid or accrued by such Member in connection with the business of the Company, or because the Member is a member. Company may advance expenses incurred by the Member in connection with the business of the Company, or in any legal action arising from action taken by the Member in connection with the business of the Company, all to the fullest extent provided or allowed by the laws of Ohio. The Company may, in its sole discretion, also indemnify any or all employees or agents of the Company for all costs, losses, liabilities and damages paid or accrued by the agent or employee in connection with the business of the Company to the fullest extent provided or allowed by the laws of Ohio.
- <u>3.4 Compensation</u>: The Member shall be reimbursed for all reasonable expenses incurred on behalf of the Company and shall be entitled to reasonable compensation for time spent managing the Company, in an amount to be determined from time to time by the Member.
- 3.5 Duty of Loyalty: The Member may engage in business and investment activities other than the Company, and need not account to the Company for profits or remuneration gained in such activities. The Member may enter into transactions considered to be competitive with or similar to those of the Company. The Member may utilize or appropriate a business opportunity beneficial to the Company, and the Company waives any right or claim to participate therein. The Member has no duty to account to the Company or to hold as trustee for the Company any property, profit or benefit derived by the Member in the formation, conduct or winding-up of the Company or from the use or appropriation of any Company property.
- <u>3.6 Other Self Interest</u>: The Member does not violate a duty or obligation to the Company merely because the Member's conduct furthers the Member's own interests. Acting in the interest of the Member shall not be grounds for imposing liability on the Member for liabilities, debts, and obligations of the Company solely for being a member. The Member may lend money to and transact other business with the Company, and the rights and obligations of the Member in such transactions shall be the same as those of a person who is not a member of the Company. No transactions with the Company shall be voidable solely because the Member has a direct or indirect interest in the transaction.

ARTICLE 4 – TAXES

4.1 Elections: The Member may make any tax elections for the Company allowed under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended from time to time ("Code"), or the tax laws of any state or other jurisdiction having taxing jurisdiction over the Company. It is the intent of the Member and the Company that the Company is to be disregarded as an entity separate from the Member for purposes of the Code.

4.2 Taxes of Taxing Jurisdiction: To the extent that the laws of any taxing jurisdiction require, the Member will prepare, execute, and submit an agreement indicating that the Member will make timely income tax payments to the taxing jurisdiction and that the Member accepts personal jurisdiction of the taxing jurisdiction with regard to the collection of income taxes attributable to the Member's income and interest and penalties assessed on such income, if such agreement is required by the taxing jurisdiction. If the Member fails to provide such agreement, the Company may withhold and pay over to such taxing jurisdiction the amount of tax, penalty, and interest determined under the laws of the taxing jurisdiction with respect to such income. Any such payments with respect to the income of the Member shall be treated as a distribution for purposes of Article 5.

ARTICLE 5 – DISTRIBUTIONS

The Company may make distributions at such times and in such amounts as determined by the Member. No distribution shall be declared and paid unless, after the distribution is made, the assets of the Company are in excess of all liabilities of the Company.

ARTICLE 6 – DISPOSITION OF MEMBERSHIP INTEREST AND ADMISSION OF ASSIGNEES AND ADDITIONAL MEMBERS

6.1 Disposition: The Member's membership interest is transferable either voluntarily or by operation of law. The Member may dispose of all or a portion of the Member's membership interest. Upon the disposition of a portion of the Member's membership interest, the transferee shall be admitted as a substitute member as to the transferred interest upon the completion of the transfer without further action. Upon the transfer of the Member's entire membership interest (other than a temporary transfer or transfer as a pledge or security interest), the Member shall cease to be a Member of the Company and shall have no further rights or obligations under this Agreement, except that the Member shall have the right to such information as may be necessary for the computation of the Member's tax liability.

<u>6.2 Admission of Additional Members</u>: The Member may, in the Member's sole discretion, admit additional members and determine the capital contributions of such additional members.

ARTICLE 7 – DISSOLUTION AND WINDING UP

7.1 Dissolution: The Company shall be dissolved and its affairs wound up, upon the will of the Member, or at such time as the Company has no members. Notwithstanding any provision of the Act to the contrary, and except as otherwise provided in the immediately preceding sentence, the Company shall continue and not dissolve as a result of the death, retirement, resignation, expulsion, bankruptcy, or dissolution of any Member or any other event that terminates the continued membership of the Member.

- 7.2 Effect of Dissolution: Upon dissolution, the Company shall cease carrying on as distinguished from the winding up of the Company business, but the Company is not terminated, but continues until the winding up of the affairs of the Company is completed and the certificate of dissolution has been issued by the Ohio Secretary of State.
- 7.3 Distribution of Assets on Dissolution: Upon the winding up of the Company, the Company's assets shall be distributed as follows: (1) to creditors, including the Member if she is a creditor, to the extent permitted by law, in satisfaction of Company liabilities; and (2) to the Member. Such distributions may be in cash, property other than cash, or partly in both, as determined by the Member.
- 7.4 Winding Up and Articles of Dissolution: The winding up of a limited liability company shall be completed when all debts, liabilities, and obligations of the limited liability company have been paid and discharged or reasonably adequate provision thereof has been made, and all of the remaining property and assets of the limited liability company have been distributed to the Member. Upon completion of winding up of the Company, the Member or other person designated by the Member or the Member's legal representative shall deliver articles of dissolution to the Secretary of State for filing. The articles of dissolution shall set forth the information required by the Act.

ARTICLE 8 - MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- 8.1 Governing Law: This Agreement shall be governed by and construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Ohio.
- 8.2 Amendments: This Agreement may be amended or modified from time to time only by a written instrument adopted by the Member and the Company and executed by the Member and the Company. In the event that there ever becomes more than one Member, this Agreement shall be amended to reflect the fact that there is more than one Member and the terms shall be approved by all Members.
- 8.3 Entire Agreement: This Agreement represents the entire agreement between the Member and the Company.
- 8.4 Severance: Every provision of this Agreement is intended to be severable. The invalidity or illegality of any particular provision of this Agreement will not affect the other provisions, and this Agreement will be construed in all respects as if such invalid or illegal provisions were omitted.

THE UNDERSIGNED, being the sole member of Covenant Weddings LLC, evidences her adoption and ratification of the foregoing Operating Agreement of the Company.







My Call to Celebrate Marriage

Since I first came to know God, He has called me to ministry. In the past, this calling brought me to Zimbabwe as a missionary. Then, to downtown Cleveland, serving the poor. Today, God has called me to officiate and write about weddings—proclaiming the beauty of marriage to others.

This is my great privilege. I believe that marriage is a special gift from God that represents Jesus's love for his Church. Through this special lifelong covenant between one man and one woman, God achieves His purpose for humanity and reveals His good news for all to see (Genesis 1:28; Genesis 2:24; Ephesians 5:25-33).

One of my greatest joys is to celebrate this relationship with others. I cherish the opportunity to learn a couple's love story and draft homilies, vows, and prayers celebrating these stories—stories that echo the greatest love story of all: Jesus sacrificing himself for others. 



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

The Scoop on Hiring a Professional Wedding Vow Writer

Op If you're struggling to write your vows, hiring a professional wedding vow writer may be a good option. Here's everything you need to know about hiring a vowwriting pro.



There are plenty of ways to add personalized touches to your wedding day, and one of the most popular and meaningful ones is by writing your own vows. Many couples choose to do this for a myriad of reasons. "People want their vows to be personal, real, touching and honest," says Jenny Block, author, writer, and speaker from Houston, Texas.

The issue, however, is that not everyone is good at putting into words what they're feeling inside. That's certainly no reason to forgo personalized vows in favor of something stale and scripted. Enter: professional vow writers, writing experts who

work alongside you to help create powerful vows that are your own. "A vow writer will ask you questions about you and your partner and then use that information to write vows that ring true for you both," says Block. "The best vow writers make the vows sound like something you would say and not like a script."

Professional vow writer Karen Davis of Rhymes by Design explains that hiring someone to write your vows is now commonplace, and akin to hiring a cake baker or photographer. "Crafting custom vows retains the spirit of the person or couple, while reaching and touching everyone beyond the basic message," she says. "It's a bit like gift-wrapping: adding a sparkle and flair that has a lasting impact well beyond the moment."

So how do you go about hiring a vow writer—and what should you know about the process? Keep reading for some informative answers!

Where can you find a professional vow writer?

Just like you'd find any other wedding vendor, you can find vow writer pretty much anywhere—at wedding shows or online (there are some listed in WeddingWire's vendor directory, too). Oftentimes people stumble upon a wedding vow writer. "They Google 'Wedding Vow ideas' and a vow writing website pops up," says Geoff Woliner, founder of Winning Wit. "Then they take a look and realize, 'Wait...I can hire someone to do this for me while I open another bottle of wine and binge something on Netflix? Sweet. Where do I sign up?" If you do go the online route, it's important to vet a vow writer, as you would any other vendor. Block suggests asking to see references and previous work as well as speaking to past clients to get a clearer idea of how well the writer was able to capture someone else's vows.

How does a vow writer work?

Every vow writer works differently, according to Avery Morgan, Senior Editor at EduBirdie, which specializes in wedding speech-writing. "We take a hands-on approach to make sure we have all of the details and insights we need to craft the perfect vows," she says. "Our writers want to get a true feeling for the couple, so we'll usually ask about how the couple met, the moment they fell in love, favorite memories, the silly things they bicker about, where they've traveled together, what they love to do together, and other similar details." These quick facts give a vow writer the tools he or she needs to craft something memorable.


How do vow writers make the vows personal?

Once a vow writer connects with a couple, they typically send a questionnaire that gathers all of the necessary information from them. "This is the secret sauce that separates your vows from something you d copy and paste off the internet," says Woliner. "We get to learn all about you—your individual backgrounds, how you met, some stories you ve shared together, some inside jokes, when you knew the other

• "Officiating Services" means the Minister's officiating of the wedding ceremony, and shall include delivering the homily, administering the vows, and signing and submitting the Client's marriage license. Client must acquire a valid marriage license and the marriage license must be on the premises when the Officiating Services are performed. At the Client's discretion, this may also include assisting the couple in planning and preparing the wedding ceremony; leading the Client through the wedding rehearsal; and attending and praying at the Client's rehearsal dinner and/or wedding reception.
• "Wedding Services" means Composition Services and Officiating Services collectively.
Requested Wedding Services Minister and Client agree that Minister shall provide the following services:
Composition Services: Homily Vows Prayer(s)
Officiating Services:
Minister and Client also agree that Minister shall provide the following elective Officiating Services: Assist in Planning and Preparing Wedding Ceremony Coordinate Wedding Rehearsal Pray During Rehearsal Dinner Pray During Wedding Reception
Fees Client agrees to pay \$ to engage Minister to provide the above requested Wedding Services. Client agrees that 1/2 of this payment is due immediately upon the execution of this contract as a deposit to reserve Minister's Wedding Services and 1/2 of this payment will be due no later than one (1) day before the date Minister is scheduled to provide the requested Wedding Services to Client.
If additional charges are incurred after the date of this Agreement, Client's agreement to incur additional charges may be memorialized in any writing, including email, and will be deemed incorporated into this Agreement and subject to its terms.

Planning the Wedding Services

Minister will schedule a consultation with Client in person, by phone, or by an online videoconference platform of Minister's choosing. The consultation may include discussing the schedule of the Wedding Services, the details of the Wedding Services, Client's relationship, engagement, hopes for marriage, Client's input for the wedding ceremony's substance and order, Client's input for content of the homily, vows, and/or prayers, Minister's recommendations for Wedding Services, and any other subject Minister determines would be helpful in order to render the requested Wedding Services.

Expenses & Travel

In addition to the above fee, Client agrees to reimburse Minister's expenses, including parking and travel expenses according to the following schedule:

Client agrees to provide Minister with detailed directions to any of the above listed locations at least two (2) weeks prior to the date of the ceremony or event.

Minister's Editorial Control and Creative License

Minister is not obligated to accept any request for Wedding Services. Client agrees that Client has reviewed or discussed Minister's prior Wedding Services and has a reasonable expectation that Minister will provide the requested Wedding Services in a similar manner. Minister agrees that the requested Wedding Services will be of a similar style and caliber to the work discussed by Minister and Client (if any) and on Minister's website and social media sites. Minister agrees that she will work with Client to do her best to accommodate Client's reasonable suggestions for any of her Wedding Services.

Client agrees that Minister retains complete artistic and editorial freedom to decide whether to provide any aspect of the Wedding Services. Client also agrees that Minister retains complete artistic and editorial freedom over every aspect of Minister's Wedding Services, including composing homilies, vows, and prayers, officiating the wedding ceremony, praying during the rehearsal or reception, and all other aspects of the Wedding Services. Minister reserves the right to reject any request or suggestion that violates Minister's religious or artistic standards.

Based on the information Minister presently has, Minister has determined that Client's requested Wedding Services do not require Minister to participate in any ceremony or event which violates,

contradicts, or is inconsistent with her artistic and religious beliefs. Likewise, Minister has determined that Client's requested Wedding Services either express messages that promote Minister's artistic or religious beliefs, or at least do not violate or contradict or are not inconsistent with those beliefs. Minister reserves the right to terminate this Agreement if Minister subsequently determines, in Minister's sole discretion, that the requested Wedding Services would require her to participate in a ceremony or event or communicate an idea or message which violate, contradict, or are inconsistent with Minister's artistic or religious beliefs. If Minister makes this determination after Client provides false information or conceals material information about Client or the requested Wedding Services, all unpaid charges under this agreement for work already completed shall become immediately due and payable.

No Warranties

Except for the express representations and warranties stated in this Agreement, Minister makes no warranties whatsoever under this Agreement, and explicitly disclaims any other warranties of any kind.

Minister's Exclusive Copyright

Client will become the owner of any physical products delivered to Client but not to the design or underlying works created by Minister. Under the Copyright Act of 1976, 17 U.S.C. § 101 et seq. and as the sole creator of these works, Minister retains all ownership, copyright, title, interest, and other intellectual property rights in these works and in any internet posts that Minister creates under this Agreement. Minister's Wedding Services are not works-for-hire under Copyright Law.

Minister reserves the right to document, advertise, display, and describe the Wedding Services rendered to Client. For example, Minister may display a homily drafted for Client on Minister's website and social media sites to advertise Minister's Wedding Services or promote Minister's beliefs about marriage.

Release

Client authorizes and consents to the use of Client's visual image by Minister at Minister's sole discretion. Uses may include but are not limited to still photography, videotape, electronic and printed publications, and publication on websites, including Minister's own website and social media site. Client waives any and all claims for payment associated with these uses.

Client's Limited License

Minister grants Client a limited license to use material created to fulfill the requested Wedding Services for personal and noncommercial uses. For purposes of this Agreement, "use" means to copy, reproduce, modify, edit, synchronize, perform, display, broadcast, publish or otherwise make use of. Client agrees that any public use of homilies or vows drafted by Minister must include a citation to the Minister. Client further agrees that they will under no circumstances alter the text of a homily, vows, or prayers created by Minister for placement in public or on the internet. Minister reserves the right to ask Client to remove any attribution from publicly displayed homilies, vows, or prayers created by the Minister.

Nonpayment, Cancellations, Re-scheduling

Minister reserves the right to void this Agreement for Client's failure to pay fees or expenses. Wedding Services will not be delivered until all fees and expenses are paid. Minister reserves the right to release Client's reserved date for Wedding Services if Client fails to make payments under this Agreement or if Minister is unable to communicate with Client after three (3) attempts.

If Client cancels a wedding ceremony or event, Client agrees that Minister will retain the deposit as the agreed loss suffered by Minister due to the cancellation. If Minister cancels the provision of Wedding Services, all money including any initial payments will be returned to Client.

Client agrees to notify Minister as soon as possible if Client needs to reschedule a Wedding Service for weather or illness or another exceptional circumstance. Minister agrees to reschedule the Wedding Services at no additional charge, but Minister cannot guarantee a particular day or timeline. If Client reschedules a wedding, Client shall reimburse Minister for any costs Minister incurs to reschedule any air travel that is reimbursable to Minister under this Agreement.

Limit of Liability

Minister shall not be liable for any failure to perform Minister's obligations in this Agreement where such failure results from any cause beyond Minister's reasonable control, such as (but not limited to) a fire, other causality, or act of God. If Minister fails to perform as required, Minister shall not be liable to the Client or any third party for any damages beyond the reimbursement of fees paid by Client to Minister. Client waives any right to recover any other type of damages, including, but not limited to, any loss of use, revenue, profit or any consequential, incidental, indirect, exemplary, special, pain and suffering, emotional, expectation, or punitive damages, whether arising out of breach of contract, tort (including negligence) or otherwise, regardless of whether such damages were foreseeable and whether or not such party has been advised of the possibility of such damages. In no event will Minister's liability related to this Agreement, whether arising out of or related to breach of contract, tort (including negligence) or otherwise, exceed the aggregate amounts paid or payable to Minister.

Choice of Venue and Waiver

Client agrees that all legal matters arising from this Agreement will be resolved in the State of Ohio in Cuyahoga County. Minister's failure to exercise any right provided in this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of any rights in this Agreement.

I. INTRODUCTION

A life committed to the rabbinate is a life committed to walking with humility before God. We recognize that ordination carries with it a commitment to live and model a life of מצוות and religious observance governed by הלכה. Whether we serve in the pulpit, educational settings, chaplaincy, the campus, communal organizations, or the military, there is no area of rabbinic service which is exempt from our dedication to בין אדם לחברו שנינו בתורתך ודבק לבנו במצוותיך ויחד לבבנו לאהבה וליראה: Just as we pray every day in the vcr vcvt: אדם למקום את שמך we dedicate ourselves to live out these words in every area of life and work.

Because our lives are bound up in this commitment to קדושה and הורה, what follows is a code of professional and ethical conduct which applies to every member of The Rabbinical Assembly in whatever rabbinic position served.

This code clarifies expected responsibilities in a number of areas related to Assembly membership, including relationships among colleagues, personal behavior, and policies and standards of the Assembly. In addition, there is a description of the אונד הכבוד and its procedures. We believe this code will be helpful to all colleagues and provide guidance in certain complex areas of concern.

II. MEMBERSHIP IN THE RABBINICAL ASSEMBLY

Membership in the Rabbinical Assembly is available to rabbis ordained from seminaries of the Conservative/ Masorti Movement. These are the Jewish Theological Seminary in New York City, the Ziegler School of Rabbinic Studies in Los Angeles, the Rabbinical School of the Schechter Institute in Jerusalem, the Seminario Rabinico Latinoamericano in Buenos Aires, and the Jewish Theological Seminary in Budapest. Membership is contingent upon receiving ordination, filing a signed membership application and being elected to membership by vote at the Rabbinical Assembly's annual meeting. Any ordainee who chooses not to become a member of the Rabbinical Assembly within one year of ordination must apply for membership through the Membership Committee.

Rabbis ordained at other recognized institutions of Jewish learning who wish to become members of the Rabbinical Assembly must go through an application process administered through the Membership Committee.

Membership may be denied or revoked if at any time there have been violations of a moral, ethical or religious nature, or there has been a criminal conviction by any court of law, or there has been disciplinary action taken by a professional body.

This code was approved by the Executive Council on October 21, 2004, 6 מרחשון 5765 Revised October 18, 2018, ט' מרחשון חשע"ט.

III. RESPONSIBILITIES OF MEMBERSHIP

Members of the Rabbinical Assembly are required to fulfill the responsibilities of membership and fulfill the halakhic and administrative policies established by the Assembly. The signing of the membership application serves as an agreement to abide by these policies and to abide by the Assembly's code of professional conduct.

Thus, while the rights and status of מרא מרא are strongly upheld by the Rabbinical Assembly, granting to each rabbi the responsibility to determine halakhic parameters for his or her congregation, institution or organization, it is expected that the rulings of the Rabbinical Assembly and of the Committee on Jewish Law and Standards will serve as halakhic guide for members of the Assembly and their communities.

"Standards of Religious Practice" are binding upon all members of the Rabbinical Assembly. Such standards are established through the Committee on Jewish Law and Standards with approval of the Assembly at an annual meeting. Current Standards of Religious Practice include:

- a) Clergy of the Conservative/Masorti Movement may grant formal Jewish status only to a person who is either born to a Jewish woman or converted with *tevilah* and (if male) *brit milah* as approved by a Beit Din, it being understood that any member of the Rabbinical Assembly shall continue to possess the right to petition the Committee on Jewish Law and Standards for an opinion on any case of extraordinary circumstances.
- b) Clergy of the Conservative/Masorti Movement may officiate in any aspect of any manner of wedding ceremony for a person previously married to a Jew only if the previous marriage was dissolved by the death of the spouse or by a divorce in both civil law and in Jewish law, the latter by a total, by another form of dissolution approved by the CJLS, or by the action of the Joint Bet Din.
- c) Clergy of the Conservative/Masorti movement may officiate at weddings only if both parties are Jewish. Officiation means signing documents or verbal participation of any kind. Attendance as a guest at a wedding where only one party is Jewish is not included in this Standard of Religious Practice.

Violations of Standards of Religious Practice usually result in expulsion from the Rabbinical Assembly.

Administrative policies and halakhic practice parameters are promulgated by the Executive Council and are binding upon the membership of the Rabbinical Assembly. These currently include:

- (1) Keeping the Rabbinical Assembly informed of current address and place of employment, if any. The Rabbinical Assembly makes every effort to maintain contact with members of the Assembly. Should such contact not be possible due to a member's failure to inform the Assembly of a current address, after one year, membership in the Assembly will end and reinstatement may only occur by application through the Membership Committee.
- (2) The filing of dues forms and timely payment of dues. Failure to file annual dues forms and complete payment of dues may result in suspension or expulsion from membership. It is also expected that all other financial obligations such as payments related to convention or attendance at seminars will also be paid when due.

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- (3) Abiding by the policies established by committees of the Rabbinical Assembly as approved by the Executive Council, such as those of the Placement Commission, Membership Committee, זעד הכבור, etc.
- (4) Abiding by *regional practices* in order to strengthen rabbinic cooperation and promote communal cohesiveness. Regional policies must conform to those of the Rabbinical Assembly and are subject to review and approval by the Executive Council. Rabbis resident in or working temporarily in a region must abide by regional policies.
- (5) Rabbinical Assembly members may not privately ordain individuals. The Rabbinical Assembly firmly opposes private ordination as undermining the high standards of rabbinic education and training, and as demeaning the trust and respect of the rabbinic profession.
- (6) If a rabbi is interested in establishing a new congregation for whatever reason, he/she must seek and receive approval of the Placement Commission.
- (7) Rabbinical Assembly members may not officiate at any civil marriage ceremonies. Colleagues may only function in rabbinic roles and may not serve in civil capacities for marriages or other ceremonies and rites. Rabbis may not officiate when a required civil marriage license has not been previously obtained.
- (8) It is Executive Council policy that גטין should be arranged through certifie מסדרי גטין who participate in the עג Registration Project of the Joint Bet Din.

Failure to abide by Rabbinical Assembly policies and/or this Code of Professional Conduct may result in disciplinary action. Administrative policy violations such as a placement violation or a failure to remit dues as required will be reviewed by the appropriate committee of the RA (e.g., Placement Commission, Administrative Committee) and disciplinary action, if any recommended. Violations of an ethical, moral or religious nature will be referred to the מועד הכבוד וועד הכבוד If necessary, a recommendation for disciplinary action will be reported to the Administrative Committee, and then voted upon by the Executive Council to become effective.

IV.RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN RABBIS

1. Within the Same Congregation

- (A) Multiple Rabbis
 - The complexity and diversity of congregational life and activity often require the engagement of two or more rabbis to better serve congregational needs. The Rabbinical Assembly encourages this practice. It brings great benefit to congregational communities and enables rabbis to be more effective in their work.
 - (1) In those congregations served by more than one rabbi, it is expected that the senior rabbi will share rabbinic duties with assistants/associates in order to enhance opportunities for rabbinic growth and development and integration into congregational life and affairs, unless the assistant/associate, by agreement, title, and/or position description, will not generally assume similar rabbinic duties (e.g., serves as educational director or executive director).
 - (2) It is expected that relationships among rabbis in the same congregation will reflect the highest degree of collegiality, respect and cooperation. It is expected that rabbis will be supportive of each other and



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ANNULMENT

An annulment is a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic church court) that a marriage thought to be valid according to Church law actually fell short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union.

The annulment process is frequently misunderstood.

These Annulment FAQs explain who needs an annulment, the process, and its effects.

What is an annulment?

"Annulment" is an unfortunate word that is sometimes used to refer to a Catholic "declaration of nullity." Actually, nothing is made null through the process. Rather, a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court) declares that a marriage thought to be valid according to Church law actually fell short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union.

For a Catholic marriage to be valid, it is required that: (1) the spouses are free to marry; (2) they are capable of giving their consent to marry; (3) they freely exchange their consent; (4) in consenting to marry, they have the intention to marry for life, to be faithful to one another and be open to children; (5) they intend the good of each other; and (6) their consent is given in the presence of two witnesses and before a properly authorized Church minister. Exceptions to the last requirement must be approved by Church authority.

Why does the Church require a divorced Catholic to obtain a declaration of nullity before marrying in the Church?

In fidelity to Jesus' teaching, the Church believes that marriage is a lifelong bond (see Matt 19:1-10); therefore, unless one's spouse has died, the Church requires the divorced Catholic to obtain a declaration of nullity before marrying someone else. The tribunal process seeks to determine if something essential was missing at the moment of consent, that is, the time of the wedding. If so, the Church can declare that a valid marriage was never actually brought about on the wedding day.

What does the tribunal process involve?

Several steps are involved. The person who is asking for the declaration of nullity – the petitioner – submits written testimony about the marriage and a list of persons who are familiar with the marriage. These people must be willing to answer questions about the spouses and the marriage. If the other spouse did not co-sign the petition, the tribunal will contact that spouse – the respondent – who has a right to be involved. In some cases the respondent does not wish to become involved; the case can still move forward.

Based upon the information that was submitted, a tribunal official will determine the process that is to be followed. Regardless of the selected process, both the petitioner and the respondent will be able to read the testimony submitted, except that protected by civil law (for example, counseling records). Each party may also appoint a Church advocate to represent him or her before the tribunal. A representative for the Church, called the defender of the bond, will argue for the validity of the marriage.

If the tribunal decides in favor of the nullity of the marriage, the parties are then free to marry in the Catholic Church, unless an appeal of the decision is lodged or the decision includes a prohibition against one or both of the parties marrying until certain underlying issues have been resolved (see Code of Canon Law, 1682.1).

How long does the process take?

The length will depend upon the type of process that is followed, e.g., the ordinary judicial process, the process before the bishop, a documentary process, or a process before a Roman court. Your diocesan tribunal will be able to give you a more exact estimate based upon your case.

How can a couple married for many years present a case?

The tribunal process examines the events leading up to, and at the time of, the wedding ceremony, in an effort to determine whether what was required for a valid marriage was ever brought about. The length of common life is not proof of validity but a long marriage does provide evidence that a couple had some capacity for a life-long commitment. It does not prove or disprove the existence of a valid marriage bond.

If a marriage is declared null, does it mean that the marriage never existed?

No. It means that a marriage that was thought to be valid civilly and canonically was in fact not valid according to Church law. A declaration of nullity does not deny that a relationship existed. It simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage.

If a declaration of nullity is granted, are the children considered illegitimate?

No. A declaration of nullity has no effect on the legitimacy of children who were born of the union following the wedding day, since the child's mother and father were presumed to be married at the time that the child was born. Parental obligations remain after a marriage may be declared null.

I do not plan to re-marry. Why should I present a marriage case?

Some people find that simply writing out their testimony helps them to understand what went wrong and why. They gain insights into themselves. Others say that the process allowed them to tell their whole story for the first time to someone who was willing to listen. A person cannot know today if they might want to marry in the future when crucial witnesses may be deceased or their own memories may have dimmed.

Why does the Catholic Church require an intended spouse, who is divorced but not Catholic, to obtain a declaration of nullity before marrying in the Catholic Church?

The Catholic Church respects the marriages of non-Catholics and presumes that they are valid. Thus, for example, it considers the marriages of two Protestant, Jewish, or even nonbelieving persons to be binding for life. Marriages between baptized persons, moreover, are considered to be sacramental. The Church requires a declaration of nullity in order to establish that an essential element was missing in that previous union that prevented it from being a valid marriage, and thus the intended spouse is free to marry.

This is often a difficult and emotional issue. If the intended spouse comes from a faith tradition that accepts divorce and remarriage, it may be hard to understand why he/she must go through the Catholic tribunal process. Couples in this situation may find it helpful to talk with a priest or deacon. To go through the process can be a sign of great love of the non-Catholic for the intended spouse.

My fiancé/e and I want to marry in the Catholic Church. He/she has been married before and has applied for a declaration of nullity. When can we set a date for our wedding?

You should not set a date until the tribunal's decision has been finalized. First, the petition may not be granted. Second, even if the petition is eventually granted, there may be unexpected delays in the process, e.g., if your fiancé/e's spouse wishes to appeal the tribunal's decision.

How much does it cost?

Pope Francis has asked dioceses whenever possible to provide their tribunal services free of charge. Depending upon how much your diocese is able to subsidize the work of its tribunal, you may be asked to pay a nominal fee. You may also be asked to make a donation following the completion of your case. Fees are typically payable over time, and may be reduced or even waived in cases of financial difficulty. Other expenses may be incurred when consultation with medical, psychological, or other experts is needed, or if you obtain the services of a private canon lawyer to represent you.

How do I start the process?

Your parish can provide the information and forms that you need to get started.

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FAQs

Where do you perform your ceremonies?

I'm not tied to any particular venue – I can perform ceremonies anywhere. I do have some favorite venues that I can suggest if you've not chosen a location yet.

How much do you charge?

My fee varies based upon the complexity of the ceremony and the distance of the ceremony venue from my location, which is Akron, Ohio. My rates are competitive, however, I will readily admit that I'm not the least expensive officiant around. Cheap goods and services are cheap for a reason – because they suck. Be wary of anyone who will perform your ceremony for an astoundingly low price, as one gets what one pays for.

Do you offer any discounts?

I offer discounts for ceremonies that meet any of the following criteria:

Take place in the morning (ending before noon) or mid-to-late-evening (beginning no earlier than 7:30 p.m. and ending no later than 10 p.m.)

Take place on a Friday or Sunday, with an additional discount applying for Monday through Thursday ceremonies

Take place in November/December, with an additional discount applying for those in January/February

We have X number of people attending our wedding. How much do you charge for a wedding that large?

I don't charge more if you have more people attending your wedding ceremony. Some officiants do, and I think it's extraordinarily lame. Whether it's just two people (namely, the couple) or 2,000 people, my fee is the same. I'm not Wayne Newton. Much. (Kidding. I'm not Wayne Newton *at all*, just to reassure you.)

What makes your wedding ceremonies different?

A church wedding is all wrong for couples that aren't religious. I provide a secular or spiritual alternative to church weddings. A justice of the peace offers the same alternative, but the resulting ceremony is dry, short and not custom-written based on the couple's tastes and beliefs.

Do you do "traditional" ceremonies using "traditional" wedding language?

That's entirely up to you. If you want to use traditional wedding language ("I, Brad, take you, Suzy, to be my lawfully wedded wife ...") I'm happy to oblige. Take a look at some of the **ceremonies I've performed** for some examples of nontraditional language. You can also do both – for example, nontraditional vows but a traditional exchange of rings. I'll say whatever makes the ceremony meaningful for you both!

We're having our wedding in a church – can you still perform the ceremony?

Churches almost always require that, at very least, an ordained member of their religious order perform a wedding ceremony that taking place in their chapel. That being said, I'm happy to perform a wedding ceremony anywhere, church or otherwise, if it can be arranged.

We wrote our own ceremony – will you simply recite it?

No. The words I speak during a wedding ceremony directly reflect on me personally and professionally. As such, I don't simply "read" ceremonies prepared by others.

Can we write our own vows?

Absolutely! I encourage you to write and recite your own wedding vows if you feel comfortable doing so.

Can we read and edit the ceremony you've written for us?

No. I ask that couples trust that I'll compose the perfect ceremony for them, and because of this, I don't allow them to read it ahead of time. The words will have much more impact if you hear them for the first time on your actual wedding day.

Our wedding is going to have a unique theme – can you write it based on that theme?

Yes, but depending on the complexity of the theme, there may be an additional fee. For instance, if you're looking for simple references to an ethnic-themed wedding, no additional fee will be required. On the other hand, if you want a traditional Klingon wedding, that's going to require some extra research, extra writing and extra money. Plus, I'll have to learn Klingon.

Can you dress a certain way for our ceremony?

I'll wear whatever you want for your ceremony – within reason. Most couples want someone in a black suit and white collared shirt, with or without a tie. If you're looking for something a little more exotic (like a cassock and cincture, or a costume for a themed wedding), extra charges will apply.

How long do your ceremonies last?

Depending on what you request to be included in the ceremony, 15-20 minutes. This doesn't include processionals or any other elements. While this might not sound like a long time, trust me – it's just right. It's a densely packed ceremony – every word is robust with meaning. Most couples (as well as most ceremony attendees) would prefer a short, purposeful ceremony – without the rambling commentary some officiants insist on engaging in – and one focused on the couple's love and not a litany of religious instructions for the married life.

Do you bring your own sound equipment?

No, it will be your responsibility to provide sound equipment if you want me to use a microphone. Please be aware – I can ONLY use a wireless, lapel microphone. Your DJ or sound person must be made aware of this in advance. I CANNOT use a traditional, handheld microphone, even on a microphone stand. In most cases, I can project quite clearly without a microphone. In all but the most necessary cases, I recommend against using one. They detract greatly from the atmosphere of the ceremony.

Do we have to attend pre-marriage counseling with you before the ceremony?

Absolutely not. I find pre-marriage counseling insulting, invasive and distasteful. I'm not a therapist, and can offer you no advice for a successful marriage other than to always love and respect each other. Similarly, I do not "screen" couples from some imaginary moral high ground to determine if they are "ready" to get married. You're both adults and I trust you've made a reasonable, informed decision to marry each other. This paragraph constitutes the whole of my pre-marriage counseling.

May we contact other couples you've performed ceremonies for?

You may! The testimonials page has comments from couples for whom I've performed ceremonies, as well as their friends and loved ones. Contact me at 330-703-2430, and let me know who you'd like me to put you in touch with. I'll also put you in touch with couples I've worked with who have *not* left testimonials, such is my confidence that their feedback will reflect the high caliber of the services I perform.

What would happen if you were unavailable to perform a scheduled ceremony?

In the **extremely** unlikely event of a catastrophic emergency, I have an associate officiant who will preside over the scheduled ceremony at a

moment's notice.

Will you shave your beard for our ceremony?

No. If you require that much control over your wedding day, I'm probably not the right person to perform your ceremony.

Do you perform gay commitment ceremonies?

I very much look forward for the day when all state governments legally recognize a gay couple's right to marry. Until then, however, I will cheerfully perform non-legally binding wedding ceremonies (sometimes referred to as commitment ceremonies) for gay couples. You can read my manifesto on gay marriage (and the senseless opposition to it) **here**.

We wish to renew our vows – can you officiate the ceremony?

I will happily celebrate a vow-renewal ceremony. The same process and fee structure is utilized as for a wedding ceremony.

Is it standard practice to "tip" the officiant? Do you accept gratuity?

Whether it's standard practice or not is a matter of some debate. Nonetheless, I expect nothing more than the agreed-upon fee. That being said, I do cheerfully accept gratuity.

Should I invite you to our rehearsal dinner or reception?

Weddings are intimate affairs for the couple's friends and family. I have no problem simply performing my duties at the rehearsal and ceremony and excusing myself. However, I'm honored by any invitation to break bread with and enjoy the company of your loved ones. However, I'm often forced to decline those kind offers, usually because of other ceremonies or rehearsals that I must attend.

You won't be offended if we don't tip you or invite you to our rehearsal dinner or reception?

Weddings are expensive enough as is. I don't begrudge anyone who wishes to spare the expense of having me at the rehearsal dinner or reception, or who wishes to forgo gratuity. I'm just happy to be a part of your wedding day!

How do we get our marriage license? Do you furnish it?

It is the responsibility of the local court authority to provide a couple with a marriage license. Fees and procedures vary from county to county. Check with your county courthouse for information and bring the entire marriage license packet with you to the ceremony.

Should we get you a boutonnière?

You don't have to, but I do like pretty flowers and looking spiffy. Just sayin'.

I spoke to someone who will do my ceremony for half of what you charge! Why bother paying the extra money?

Couples spend thousands upon thousands of dollars (even for modest weddings) on details that most attendees – and sometimes even the couple – forget. Most people who attend your wedding won't remember what the flowers looked like, if the groom wore a vest or a cummerbund, or the quality of paper the program was printed on. What they will remember is if the ceremony went smoothly, and the person officiating seemed bright, thoughtful and seemed to genuinely know, care for and connect with the couple. They'll also remember if the officiant rambled, pronounced names wrong, or said something grating or offensive that clearly didn't fit into the couple's worldview. When it comes to wedding officiants, you get what you pay for. Opt for the plain green beans rather than the green beans almondine at your reception, and use the extra \$50 or \$100 you'll save to spring for the best officiant you can find. You and your guests will remember your officiant, but not their side dish.

The other officiant I spoke to is a doctor of divinity! Doesn't that make him/her more qualified than you?

<Insert Expletive Here> no. Historically, a doctor of divinity degree is conferred to an individual by a university to teach theology or related religious subjects. In the United States, a true doctor of divinity degree is honorary. However, several organizations "sell" these degrees (or the equally meaningless doctor of metaphysics degree) to people willing to

shell out \$30. I find the practice insulting to the true scholars who have worked tirelessly to earn a true doctor-level degree from an accredited university. Anyone who wears the letters DD, MsCD or any other nonsense after their name should be approached with skepticism. Not only has this officiant deluded him or herself into believing they are a doctor, they are trying to delude you into believing it, too. You should be wary of doing business with someone so dishonest.

What are you exactly, anyway? A priest? A minister? A justice of the peace?

I am ordained by the Universal Life Church and licensed by individual jurisdictions (the secretaries of state in Ohio and West Virginia, and in Pennsylvania, within each individual county's Clerk of Orphans' Court) to solemnize marriages. That's all. I am not a priest, minister, rabbi, or anything of the sort. Nor am I a justice of the peace, as I'm not a judge. I'm just a guy who can legally marry people.

So what do we call you, then?

Some ordained individuals like to be called reverend (or occasionally father or brother.) I disdain any such title. The title of "reverend" implies the bearer of said title should be revered. This, to me, implies moral authority, and as I do not claim such authority (nor do I consider any person – living, dead or yet to be born – to be worthy of that claim), I gently but firmly insist that you call me "Tim" or "dude." (You know, that or, uh, His Dudeness, or, uh, Duder, or El Duderino if you're not into the whole brevity thing.)

Is this your full-time job?

It is now! I said farewell to my day job in 2011, and I now officiate weddings full-time. But it's far more than just a job for me – it is a passion and something that I enjoy immensely. I'm very fortunate to get paid to do something I love so much.

How many ceremonies have you performed? How often do you perform ceremonies?

When I began in 2010, I performed 22 ceremonies. In 2012, I performed 85 ceremonies. I anticipate performing more than 100 ceremonies each year from 2013 onward. In the summer and the warmer months of spring and fall, I perform anywhere from two-to-six ceremonies each weekend, and three-tofour each month in the late fall, winter and early spring months.

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We need to get married yesterday! How quickly can you perform our ceremony?

If you're looking for a "quickie" ceremony and your wedding license is about to expire – or if you need a ceremony on short notice for any other reason – I can perform most ceremonies the same day. Just **contact me**.

What are some of the best anagrams of your name?

Hoagie Me Trust, Atheist Morgue, Age The Tourism, Goatee This Rum and Meager Hot Suit.

How many tattoos do you have?

It depends on what you count as a single tattoo. Conservatively speaking, I have nine, but I've been "under the needle" many more times than that.

Which one is your favorite?

This one.

What's the story behind it?

Are any of them visible when you're clad in your marryin'-people garb? Our grandparents will probably stroke out if you've got some Mike Tyson-esque shit going on.

Negatory. Nothing on my hands, neck or face.

You're a very silly person.

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That's not a question.

Do you live in a great house?

Contrary to popular belief, my house is merely adequate.

How would you categorize your ethical and moral perspective of people, creatures and societies?

Chaotic Good.

How much wood would a woodchuck chuck if a woodchuck could chuck wood?

Alright, now you're just pissing me off.

You seem like a bit of a jokester.

That's not a question either, but it's true. I don't take myself too seriously—life is too short, in my opinion, to adhere to culture's arbitrary and incredibly boring standards of propriety—but I do take my job very, very seriously. A solemn ceremony need not be without humor, and it's an ingredient I don't neglect. - The balance of my fee for services is due 15 days before the ceremony day.

 In addition to the balance of my fee for services, a \$100 Timeline Retainer is required 15 days before the ceremony day. The Timeline Retainer will be refunded 24 hours after the wedding provided the ceremony started on time. (See Ceremony Start Time below)

Ceremony Content

- . I'll write your entire wedding ceremony based upon the notes I take in our meetings and our communication.
- All that you need to do is look over information that I send you and make choices, making any changes that you wish.
 Please do not ask me to deliver a pre-written ceremony script, as that is not what I do. If you have something that you wish to include to the ceremony that I am preparing, just let me know 30 days before the wedding. Some of it I may use verbatim, some I may not, depending on how I feel it flows within the ceremony
- . I don't write religious based ceremonies but I am comfortable talking about your faith being important to you and playing a role and purpose for you within your marriage. I am also open to scripture readings or readings that have religious themes. I don't personally offer prayers or blessings but am happy to give space for someone to step up and offer a prayer or blessing to mirror your faith.

Ceremony Start Time

- Punctuality is extremely important, so please begin your wedding ceremony at it's scheduled time. Timeliness is very critical to the venue and other vendors as
- well as courteous to your guests. Late starts often reverberate poorly through the rest of the day.

 If there is a delay in starting your wedding, there is a chance that I will not be able to perform your ceremony, as I may have other appointments, commitments or another ceremony to officiate after your ceremony.
- If the ceremony begins within 30 minutes of the Start Time, the \$100 Timeline Retainer will be refunded within 24 hours. If the wedding ceremony begins over 30 minutes past the Start Time, the Timeline Retainer will be forfeited and there is a chance that I may not be able to perform your ceremony.
 If your ceremony is over 45 minutes late to begin there will be an additional \$50 charge per each fifteen minute interval and there may be a chance that I will
- not be able to perform your ceremony. . The Start Time of your ceremony that we agree on at booking may be the only time that I can be available. If you change the Ceremony Start Time, please let
- me know immediately. . I will arrive on-site early, usually 30 minutes prior, to give you reassurance that that there are no delays on my part and to complete day-of tasks.

Rehearsal

- Because every wedding is different, every couple's needs are different and every budget is different, a rehearsal is not included in my wedding fee.
 Although I'm not a Wedding Planner/Coordinator, I'm very skilled at coordinating rehearsals. We can talk in detail about whether I need to be a part of your rehearsal and what the fee will be.

- I am required by law to have the license before I can marry you. Without it, I will not be able to perform your ceremony. (It is a misdemeanor for an officiant to perform a wedding ceremony without a marriage license). Please bring your marriage license with you to the wedding and make sure that I have it before the
- ceremony begins.

 The County Clerk/Recorder will reject a license with any mistakes made in filling out the witness or officiant section. If this happens, the county clerk charges you a replacement license fee and reissues the license.

 Before your witness(s) signs the license, I very carefully instruct them exactly how they are to fill in the fields. If the witness makes a mistake, you will be
- responsible for the replacement fee, so choose a trustworthy witness. If I make a mistake in my section, I will pay the fee.

Cancellation

- Once your date is secured, I will turn away other weddings that will possibly conflict with yours.
 If your wedding is cancelled for any reason, please bear in mind that I may have turned away one or more weddings because of my commitment to yours and I have already put in many hours of work into your wedding so the Booking Retainer is non-refundable.
 If you cancel your wedding within 30 days of its scheduled date for any reason, the entire fee is due and payable on the day of cancellation.

- If you cancer your wedoing within 30 days on its scrieduled date for any feasori, in entire feel or lead of cancernation.
 If you change your ceremony start time and I am unable to accommodate the new time, I will retain your retainer and finding another officiant is your responsibility. As a courtesy, I will reach out to my network of local officiants and do my best to help you find a stand-in.
 If I am unable to officiate on your wedding day for any reason, my fee will be waived, I'll refund your Booking Retainer and you will be responsible for finding another officiant as well as the fee of the person who officiates. As a courtesy, I will reach out to my network of local officiants and do my best to help you find a

By remitting your Booking Retainer you are agreeing to the conditions herein and this is our contract. Upon request, I can provide you with a PDF contract for both of us to sign. Upon receipt of your Booking Retainer I will book your wedding into my calendar, reserve a block of time for your wedding and promise to perform your wedding.

Q: How much will you charge to perform our wedding?

A: Arrangements with me are based on the location and details of your wedding, and I'm happy to work with your budget concerns. (I don't want to turn anyone away!) I'd be glad to discuss these details with you at your free, inperson wedding consultation, and I have many references can give you upon request. (click here to read wedding client reviews)

<u>Q: Do you require a deposit to book our wedding?</u>

A: A deposits will secure wedding date with me. You may put down a deposit when you make arrangements for me to perform your wedding, and then pay the balance the day of your wedding, or in installments, so to break up the cost into more than one payment. I can also accept credit cards via Paypal or Square.

Down payments also serve as a reminder to you, should your plans change before the date arrives, you'll remember to tell me!!! :) I have to turn many couples away who request a date once it has been booked, and you'd be surprised how easy it is to forget to tell me plans got postponed or cancelled. Deposits and installments are also an excellent way to survive the Winter months when there are fewer marriages to perform, but when many couples begin to plan their weddings for the following year.

If you wish for me to offer the Eucharist or Communion at your ceremony, purchase supplies to assist with decorating, or some other special request that requires me to make purchases for your ceremony, this will also require a deposit to cover the costs of the wine and the wafers, or other requested supplies.

I am always happy to bring things I already own to help enhance your ceremony location, such as an altar with flowers and/or wedding candles, seasonal garlands, wreaths, et al. 

Q: How do we know you have a legal minister's license and can sign our marriage certificate?

I am happy to provide a copy of my credentials to you upon request. I am legally ordained through the Universal Ministries, and am licensed to solemnize marriages from the Secretary of State in Ohio. You are also welcome to compare them with the minister's database which is kept by our government and gives you the opportunity to verify the credentials of any ordained minister who is legally licensed to solemnize marriages. Click here to check my credentials on the Secretary of the State of Ohio's website.



Q: What will you wear when you perform our wedding ceremony?

A: I have a variety of "looks" you can select from that will compliment the style and theme of your wedding. (some pictures at the <u>top of this page</u>) We can discuss this at your consultation. Costuming by request.

Q: Do you perform theme weddings?

A: Renaissance weddings, Halloween weddings, Christmas weddings, beach weddings, Celtic weddings, Scottish weddings, military weddings, etc. We can design almost any theme you might desire for your ceremony. Our property is always elaborately decorated for Halloween during the entire month of October, as well as the month of December for Christmas.

Q: We Love the idea of having you design our wedding vows and perform our ceremony. Are there other ways in which you can help us plan our wedding?

In Ohio, both the Bride and Groom need to apply for the marriage license together at the Clerk of Courts in the county in which you reside, unless you are from out-of-state, in which case you will apply for your marriage license in the county in which you will get married. Click here to apply for your County Marriage License Online! Typically this license must be signed by a licensed officiant within 90 days of obtaining it or it will expire. You will both need to go together, and will both need your drivers license or State issued picture ID. If either of you have been married in the past, you will need to bring proof that the marriage has legally ended by divorce or death. If between the ages of 18 and 21, you'll also need a copy of your birth certificate. If between the ages of 16 and 18, parental consent is required.

In Ohio there is no waiting period to receive your marriage license, and no blood tests are required. Average cost of a marriage license runs between \$45, though some counties charge more. For more information regarding marriage licenses in Ohio, click here. For a list of phone numbers and addresses for Ohio county clerk of courts, click here. For all other states, click here.

For couples who wish to solemnize their vows, but who do not wish to apply for a State-issued marriage license, I am happy to provide you with a lovely Certificate of Marriage that allows you to record and display the date you took your vows on a decorative document.

Q: Do you perform re-marriage, anniversary, or renewal of vows ceremonies?

A: Yes, I do perform renewal of marriage ceremonies. I would be very happy to design your "second wedding" and help you to renew your wedding vows so that it exceeds your expectations.

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Q: We already had a legal Justice-of-the-Peace service, but now we wish to have a formal wedding ceremony and reception we can share with our family and friends. Would you perform the ceremony for us, even though we are already legally married?

A: Yes, I would love to solemnize your Union with the eyes of Loved Ones before you. No reason to skip the traditions and rituals with Family just because you had reasons to expedite the legal portion of your marriage! :)

Q: We would like to have a marriage ceremony, but do not care to obtain a marriage license. Will you bless or solemnize our wedding without a legal, state-issued document?

A: Yes, I will gladly allow you to say your vows with each other without a state-issued license. I understand there are some who wish to ask for God and Family to be part of their marriage, but not the government. If at some point in the future you choose to obtain a marriage license, I would be happy to sign it for you at that point in time as well.

Q: We do not live in Ohio, but we've heard of your unique, original wedding ceremonies. Can you design a ceremony for our Officiant to use, or can we purchase an original ceremony from you? Do you perform destination weddings?

A: If you are getting married outside of Ohio, but wish to inquire about obtaining an original ceremony with original vows for your own wedding, please click here. I am also willing to travel the entire globe to perform weddings. Name your wedding location, world-wide, and I'll inquire as to legal requirements for performing the ceremony. I'll follow you anywhere in the United States and Internationally to make your destination wedding perfect.

O: We live in another state, but are getting married in Ohio to be with ou family for our wedding. Can you <u>help us plan our wedding ceremony via long-distance?</u>

A: I would be delighted to help you with your Ohio wedding ceremony while you reside out-of-state. Many people choose to get married in the hometown of their parents or other relatives to make it easier for family to attend. We can work on the details of your ceremony through email and telephone conversations. If there is opportunity to fit in a meeting before the wedding, I am happy to meet with you. But I have performed weddings for many out-of-town couples who need this extra leeway, and I find it is just as easy to provide excellent service to you in this manner as in any other.

You will need to apply for your Ohio marriage license together, in person, in the county you will be married in, once you are in Ohio. But there is no waiting period once you apply, so you can obtain your license on any business hours, as close as the morning you will get married, if you can find the time. Most folks tend to arrive in town a App. 152 few days before their wedding, so I suggest getting your marriage license as soon as possible so that detail on your list is tended to. (click here to read more about marriage licenses)

Q: Can you help us with our ceremony music?

A: Absolutely yes! Most couples tend to select either live musicians to perform their ceremony music (violinists, bagpipes, guitarists, organists, harpists, etc.), or prerecorded ceremony music. I can help you select from the best choices available in professional musicians, and/or I can provide you with hand-selected pre-recorded music and player for your wedding. Whether you prefer to walk down the aisle to traditional bagpipes, live guitar music, traditional classical wedding marches, or something more contemporary, I can help you arrange the perfect music for your wedding ceremony.

Q: Do you require we take Pre Marital Counseling/Classes?

A: No counseling or classes are required, unless requested by the couple. Relationship dynamics is an area of specialty of mine, so I am very happy to offer counseling services for individuals, couples and families. \$50 per session; 90 minute minimum per counseling session.



Q: My fiancé is in the military. Do you offer any discounts to people who are on leave from active duty?

A: While I do not offer any specific "discounts" to active duty personnel, I do offer the same negotiable arrangements to everyone who requests my services. (click here to read about it) I perform many wedding ceremonies for military brides and military grooms, and am very happy to offer an American Flag that can stand alone in any location and extends up to 8 feet to be part of your wedding ceremony, if you'd like. I can also help you rehearse your Arch of Swords for your ceremony exit.

It is common to find good deal and special courtesies from hotels and such for folks who are serving in the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard, etc. Deals are often available for folks who are on leave from active combat duties.

Planning sessions: I like to get together with a couple for a face-to-face meeting for an initial interview in which we ask each other questions and get a feel for the task at hand. This allows us to get better acquainted and helps me better design the wedding vows and wedding ceremony. My schedule is most flexible if you are able to meet here, at my home in Mentor on the Lake, and I'm happy to put a pot of tea or coffee on most any time. Additional meetings are arranged if requested by the couple, and there is no limit to how many times I will meet with you.

2. NARROW IN ON YOUR AESTHETIC

version. Once you approve it, you will receive a high quality file which you can have printed at your local print shop. This option will cost you less than \$10 for the digital file, plus whatever the print shop charges you to produce your desired number of invites.

Or, if you know your way around Adobe inDesign, you can make your own invitations. There are Star Wars fonts available online that are free for non-commercial use. After you download the font, open the .ttf file. Once it's done, you'll see the new font pop up in your regular font lists in your Adobe and Microsoft programs. We will leave the rest of the design to your creativity.

The Wedding Details

Now that you've gotten the preliminary to-do's checked off, it's time to start thinking about the really fun stuff, like costumes and decorations. We have some ideas to help get you started, but we bet your own creativity will end up yielding your favorite details of the day.

One place to start is by checking out what other couples have done to draw inspiration. If you do some googling, you'll find a trove of couples that have pulled together incredible Star Wars themed weddings. recommend choosing a minimalist gown with a high boat neck and long sleeves rather than ordering a costume. Here's one from Milamira Bride that fits the bill perfectly. We also love this option from Mimetik, which is more versatile -- it can be wrapped in a variety of different styles so you have some options to play with once you receive it in the mail.

Imagine the bride holding a bouquet of elegant calla lilies in one of these chic gowns. And instead of going for a belt made to look exactly like Leia's -- which may be a bit too utilitarian-looking for your wedding day -- go with a more ornate silver waist belt, like this one.

This style of "infinity dresses" are perfect for the bridesmaids. Their long drape harkens to the general style of the costume design seen on many of the characters in the series -- plus, your bridesmaids will enjoy choosing how they want to wrap the dresses, which are also customizable depending on how you choose to wrap them. These come in jewel tones like deep blue and purple to match your color palette, but of course, do some poking around online and in bridal shops to see if any other options jump out at you.

The hairstyles of the bride and her bridesmaids will help complete your looks. This video shows you Leia's trademark buns, plus Rey and Padmé's unique styles. This second video shows

I got to do my first Star Wars themed wedding. They asked me to dress up and prepare a Star Wars



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
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


Florida man officiates weddings as 'Pirates of the Caribbean' Capt. Jack Sparrow

Camp does about 120 to 125 weddings per year, he said, with 12 to 15 of those dressed as Captain Jack.



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

Wicca, a predominantly Western movement whose followers practice witchcraft and nature worship and who see it as a religion based on pre-Christian traditions of northern and western Europe. It spread through England in the 1950s and subsequently attracted followers in Europe and the United States.

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Although there were <u>precursors</u> to the movement, the origins of modern Wicca can be traced to a retired British civil servant, Gerald Brousseau Gardner (1884–1964). Gardner spent most of his career in Asia, where he became familiar with a variety of occult beliefs and magical practices. He also read widely in Western <u>esoteric</u> literature, including the writings of the British occultist Aleister Crowley. Returning to England shortly before the outbreak of World War II, Gardner became involved in the British occult <u>community</u> and founded a new movement based on a reverence of nature, the practice of <u>magic</u>, and the worship of a female deity (the Goddess) and numerous associated deities (such as the Horned God). He also borrowed liberally from Western witchcraft traditions. Following the 1951 repeal of England's <u>archaic</u> Witchcraft Laws, Gardner published *Witchcraft Today* (1954), founded his first coven of followers, and, with input from its members, especially author Doreen Valiente, developed modern witchcraft into what today is known as Wicca. It spread quickly to the United States in the late 1960s, when an emphasis on nature, unconventional lifestyles, and a search for spirituality divorced from traditional religions were especially in vogue.

Covens, which ideally number 10 to 15 members and are entered through an initiation ritual, sometime align with one of many coven associations. As coven members master the practice of magic and become familiar with the rituals, they pass through two degrees of initiation. There is a third degree for those who wish to enter the priesthood. In Gardner's system priority is given to the priestess, and leaders in the Gardnerian community trace their authority through a lineage of priestesses back to Gardner's coven.

Despite variation within the Wiccan community, most believers share a general set of beliefs and practices. They believe in the Goddess, respect nature, and hold both polytheistic and pantheistic views. Most Wiccans accept the so-called Wiccan Rede, an ethical code that states "If it harm none, do what you will." Wiccans believe in meditation and participate in rituals throughout the year, celebrating the new and full moon, as well as the vernal equinox, summer solstice, and Halloween, which they call Samhain. Wiccan rites include invoking the aid of the deities, practicing ceremonial magic, and sharing a ritual meal.

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Most controversial to outsiders is that Wiccans call themselves *witches*, a term which most Westerners identify with Satanism. As a result, Wiccans are continually denying any connection with Satan or devil worship. Wiccans have also attempted to establish ties with other polytheistic (Hindu) and nature-oriented (Native American) religious communities.

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Later Developments

By the 1980s there were an estimated 50,000 Wiccans in western Europe and North America. Although the growth rate slowed by the end of the decade, Wicca gained increasing social acceptance and diversified to include numerous variations on Gardner's original teachings and rituals. Moreover, new Wiccan groups emerged independent of the Gardnerians, including one led by Alexander Sanders (1926–1988), the Dianic Wiccans who saw Wicca as a woman's religion, and the parallel Neo-Pagan movement, which also worshipped the Goddess and practiced witchcraft but eschewed the designation witch. A major controversy developed in the United States in the 1960s and 1970s, when a faction of Wiccans broke with Gardner's notion that clothes inhibited

magical workings and chose not to follow his practice of worshipping in the nude. Instead they donned ritual robes, claiming pre-Gardnerian sources for their beliefs, and called themselves Traditionalists.

As Wicca and Neo-Paganism moved into their second generation, belief faded in the notion that Gardner had inherited a set of witchcraft rituals and practices that had been passed on through a tradition with unbroken ties to pre-Christian paganism. Although many Wiccans once cited the work of Margaret Murray, including *The Witch-Cult in Western Europe* (1921) and her article "Witchcraft" published in the 14th edition of the *Encyclopædia Britannica* (1929), in support of their belief in the ancient origins of their religion, they now generally recognize that Wicca began with Gardner and his associates.

As the 21st century began, Wiccans and Neo-Pagans were found throughout the English-speaking world and across northern and western Europe. Estimates of adherents ranged dramatically, with the number of Wiccans in the United States believed to be between 100,000 and more than 1.5 million. The Pagan Federation, an international fellowship, serves the larger Wiccan/Neo-Pagan community.

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Happily, Ever Open

What's the wedding like when the couple is in an open or polyamorous relationship?

Daley South had six bridesmaids in her 2016 wedding to Logan South; one of them was her husband's girlfriend.

The Souths are in an open and polyamorous relationship and have been since they started dating seven years ago. "We were actually all dating at first," Ms. South said of her bridesmaid, Ilona Westenra. "I really enjoyed having her be a part of our big day."

There weren't any rules about how Mr. South should interact with his girlfriend during the wedding. All of their guests knew about their relationship status (although their parents weren't completely on board) and Ms. South was perfectly fine with them spending time together during the event, which was at the TFWC Mansion in Austin, Tex.

"As long as he and I were the main focus for that one big day, I was perfectly content," said Ms. South, 31, who is a certified wedding planner. So, Mr. South, 32, did kiss his girlfriend a few times but said he spent "the entire night by my new wife's side."

People are becoming more curious about consensual non-monogamy. A 2015 study from the Journal of Sex Research found that searches for terms related to polyamorous, non-monogamous and open relationships have been rising steadily for the past decade.

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But questions remain: Will the couple stay open after the wedding? What is a wedding like when the couple is non-monogamous? Are other partners invited or involved? What are the vows like? Actually, the most common question the Souths got was, "What's the point of the wedding?"

Sarah Fraser, a licensed clinical psychologist practicing in New York City, specializes in unconventional partnerships and sexuality. She has heard from several patients that outsiders who have expressed "being non-monogamous might be acceptable before a couple gets married." They felt those outsiders expected them to "close their relationship after marriage because then the relationship is more 'serious.'"

But within their circle, everyone was extremely excited about the Souths' union.

The groom's girlfriend, Ms. Westenra, said through an email: "Being in a relationship with the groom obviously offered some awkwardness but the love far outweighed any uncomfortability. Seeing my boyfriend marry the love of his life was the most beautiful thing I've ever felt. The love in that room was so overwhelming I couldn't feel anything but pure love and happiness for the two of them and in extension, myself, because I get to be a part of this wonderful family."

People who choose to be in non-monogamous relationships are often perceived as anti-commitment, said Cathy Keen, 39, the community manager of alternative dating app Feeld and who is one-third of her relationship.

But that's just wrong, said Ms. Keen, who was also asked "what the point was" when she married her non-monogamous partner. "The thing I think a lot of people presume about a relationship that's not traditional, monogamous or heteronormative is that commitment is not valued. It's based upon sex and being able to move quickly, and that's just wrong," she said.

"Thomas and I are very committed to one another and our family unit." She's been married to her husband, Thomas Keen, 34, since 2013, and they've always been open. They've been in a three-person relationship for two years. The Keens also have an 8-year-old son.

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Ms. South did not object to Mr. South interacting with his girlfriend during the wedding. "As long as he and I were the main focus for that one big day, I was perfectly content," she said. Creatrix Photography

The couple, though, weren't dating anyone else when they got married. Their third partner wasn't in the picture at the time, but if she had been, Ms. Keen said she would have been invited to the wedding.

The Souths had 350 people at their wedding. "We wanted absolutely everyone who has made an impact on our lives to be there," Ms. South said.

On the big day, it seems common for open couples to invite or include their other partners. Anastasia Stevenson, a wedding planner in Los Angeles and Boothbay Harbor, Me., has planned hundreds of events, including two polyamorous ceremonies. One took place at a spa in Malibu, Calif., where a heterosexual couple was having a legal ceremony, with their additional partners incorporated into various parts of the event.

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"Two women in their relationship served as bridesmaids; one man in the relationship acted as best man for the groom and 'gave' the bride away," Ms. Stevenson said. "The event was framed as a celebration for all of them, not just the marrying couple."

The other wedding she planned for a polyamorous couple was a little more complicated because the bride's parents didn't know about their openness, though the other partners were still invited.

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"It's not just about the ability to sleep with other people, it's a freedom to access love in different forms," said Bethany Meyers and Nico Tortorella, who were married last year in a private ceremony at City Hall. They were matching outfits designed by Mr. Tortorella's ex boyfriend. Victoria Mathews

The actor Nico Tortorella, 31, wed the founder of the be.come project, Bethany C. Meyers, 33, in 2018. Their ceremony took place at the Manhattan Marriage Bureau with no guests. Their photographer was their witness, and they also had an assistant there to make sure things ran smoothly. They didn't have a reception. However, Tortorella's ex-boyfriend, Andrew Morrison, designed their outfits and was there to help them get ready.

(The couple does not use gender-specific honorifics, and each prefers the pronoun they.)

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"Even if they were still dating, I would have wanted him to design our outfits," Meyers said. Tortorella said if Meyers had been in a meaningful relationship at the time, they would have wanted that person there.

One other small detail noted in the South and Keen weddings was the elimination of any mention of "forsaking all others" in the ceremony. At the same time, neither couple put anything in their self-written vows about continuing to keep their relationship open. The closest the Keens came was in a speech Ms. Keen gave during the reception.

"I wrote a poem and in there I said something about how many people are a part of our relationship, no one picked up on it," she recalled.

Other than that, all of these weddings were a lot like any other wedding you'd get invited to or hear about. "We wanted the wedding to be a complete showcase of who we are as a couple," Ms. South said. "We wanted people to walk in and immediately say, 'Yep, this is Logan and Daley," Mr. South said. That meant having a twin flame ceremony, custom dishes (Mr. South's request) and no first look. "It was super important to me to have the first time we saw each other at the end of the aisle," Ms. South said.

For the Keens, that meant getting married at Chelsea Town Hall in London, riding off on bikes with water bottles tied to the back wearing leather jackets with "Just Married" written on them and having a big party at a club with hundreds of guests. But most symbolically, it also meant incorporating nature, because "this is the most

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natural relationship either of us have ever had," Ms. Keen said. When they decided to "open" their relationship, she said, it was "natural." After their town hall ceremony, they had another ceremony that 120 friends and family members attended at Wormholt Park in London. When they said their vows, they took off their shoes.

"It felt right, this relationship felt to both of us not like a trap, not like this impossible set of ideals that you have to live up to, which I really felt in previous relationships and so did he," Ms. Keen said. "So, we took it out of a church, we got rid of the whole pomp and procedure, and we made it about family and our son and about the earth and the moment."

Tortorella and Meyers, who are nonbinary, prioritized intimacy and their outfits. "We were both wearing pants with like a robe over it and we both had crowns on," Meyers said. Tortorella said the Grecian-style designs reflected them. "What we wore, we both represented this gender nonconformity and this equalness that is really important in our relationship," said Tortorella, who addresses their journey to fluidity in the memoir "Space Between," which was recently published by Penguin Random House.

The Malibu wedding Ms. Stevenson planned involved clothing optional events and the hosts were all in various stages of undress throughout the event.

"The overall feeling was one of joy and a deliberate playfulness without inhibitions," Ms. Stevenson said. She believes this is what can make a non-monogamous wedding different from that of a monogamous couple's wedding. "I absolutely think that relationship status and a couple's attitude toward their relationship and life in general directly affects their event planning," she said. The other wedding was "completely traditional."

However, even though that still-closeted couple's wedding was more "staid and rigid," Ms. Stevenson said, they hosted another party after the formal ceremony and reception, where they celebrated openly with their other partners, without their family.

Ms. Keen believes it takes a certain person to make an open relationship work, and "not a neurotic person or a paranoid person."

"All three of us are very, very comfortable in our own skin," she said of herself, her husband and their girlfriend. "That makes you a much better participant in this kind of relationship. Because you're not relying on anyone else to give you stability. You're relying on yourself, you're making your own rules and you have your own boundaries."

All three brides found wedding planning to be minimally stressful, if at all.

Tortorella sees it similarly. "I think there's just a level of freedom that exists in every part of our relationship, or really any non-monogamous relationship, that doesn't necessarily exist in a monogamous relationship," Tortorella said. "And it's not just about the ability to sleep with other people. It's a freedom to access love in different forms. And I think our wedding reflected that."

At the end of the day, Meyers believes the essence of a wedding is the same no matter what the couple believes in terms of monogamy. "It was really just about Nico and me and the most beautiful day I've ever experienced," Meyers said.

"And I feel like no matter what kind of wedding you have, that feeling exists. It's the underlying theme, and I think that's what makes weddings so special."

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LGB Families and Relationships: Analyses of the 2013 National Health Interview Survey

Executive Summary

The addition of a sexual orientation identity measure to the 2013 National Health Interview Survey (NHIS) offers a new data source to consider characteristics of families and explore differences among those led by same-sex and different-sex married and unmarried couples and LGB individuals who are not married or cohabiting. These analyses consider differences and similarities across these groups with regard to demographic characteristics including gender, age, race/ethnicity, educational attainment, geographic location, and child-rearing.

The analyses suggest that there are an estimated 690,000 same-sex couples in the United States. Approximately 18% of whom, or more than 124,000, reported that they were married. If estimates of married same-sex couples are derived only from the portion of 2013 that followed the US Supreme Court ruling in *United States v. Windsor* and are not based on data collected prior to the ruling (which effectively provided for federal recognition of the marriages of same-sex couples), then the estimate of married same-sex couples increases to 130,000.

Other key findings from the analyses include:

- An estimated 4 in 10 LGB adults (40%) reported either being married or in a cohabiting relationship with a partner compared to 6 in 10 non-LGB adults (60%).
 - Among women, more than half who identified as lesbian (51%) were married or in a cohabiting partnership compared to 57% of non-LGB women. Among bisexual women, the comparable figure was 32%.
 - O Just over a third of gay and bisexual men (35% and 34%, respectively) were coupled compared to 63% of non-LGB men.
- A higher proportion of same-sex couples lived in the West when compared to different-sex couples (32% v. 23%, respectively) while a lower portion lived in the Midwest (12% v. 23%, respectively). Among those not in a couple, LGB individuals were less likely than their non-LGB counterparts to live in the Midwest (15% v. 22%).
 - Married same-sex couples were much more likely than their different-sex counterparts to live in the Northeast (39% v. 17%, respectively), where marriage for same-sex couples was the most widely available in 2013. An estimated 12% of married same-sex couples lived in the South compared to 38% of their different-sex counterparts.
 - Unmarried same-sex couples were more likely than their unmarried different-sex couple counterparts to live in the West and less likely to live in the Midwest.
- Those in same-sex couples and LGB individuals who were not part of a couple were generally younger than their different-sex coupled and non-LGB counterparts, respectively.
- Same-sex couples were twice as likely as their different-sex counterparts to be inter-racial/ethnic (19% v. 9%, respectively).
- Those in same-sex couples, particularly married same-sex couples, and LGB individuals who were not in a couple were more likely than those in different-sex couples and non-LGB individuals, respectively, to have a college degree. Two-thirds of individuals in married same-sex couples (66%) had a college degree.
- An estimated 19% of same-sex couples and LGB individuals who were not in a couple were raising children under the age of 18 in the home.
 - o An estimated 30,000 children under age 18 have married same-sex parents while 170,000 have unmarried same-sex parents.
 - o Between 1.1 and 2 million children under age 18 have an LGB parent who is not part of a married or unmarried couple.

Introduction

Substantial demographic research exists focusing on analyses of cohabiting same-sex couples identified in US Census Bureau data (Black et al. 2000; Gates and Ost 2004; Gates and Cooke 2010; Baumle 2013; Kastanis and Wilson 2013). Unfortunately, the Census Bureau data do not provide a very accurate way to identify married same-sex couples (O'Connell and Feliz 2011; Gates and Steinberger 2009; Cohn 2014). Comparisons of demographic and geographic characteristics among those in married and unmarried same-sex couples along with lesbian, gay, or bisexual (LGB) individuals who do not have a spouse or cohabiting partner are relatively rare.

The addition of a sexual orientation identity measure to the 2013 National Health Interview Survey (NHIS) offers a new data source to consider characteristics of families and explore differences among those led by same-sex and different-sex married and unmarried couples and LGB individuals who are not married or cohabiting. Data and methodology

Table 1 presents details of the NHIS data used in these analyses. It is a publically-funded survey conducted by the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS). The survey samples families in the US and collects information on all members of those families, including their relationship to a reference person identified in each family. It is this information that allows for identification of families led by married and unmarried same-sex or different-sex couples. An adult-only sample (drawn from the family respondents) includes a question that allows respondents to describe their sexual orientation identity.

Analyses include descriptions of family characteristics (e.g., region of residence, child-rearing) and characteristics of individual adults (e.g., age, race/ethnicity, educational attainment, sexual orientation identity). Estimates use weighting procedures provided by the NHIS that allow for population estimates and interpretation of findings to be considered representative of families and the adult population (aged 18 and older) in the US.

In charts and figures that compare estimates between same-sex and different-sex couples or LGB and non-LGB adults, differences that are statistically significant are shown in **boldface** while differences that are not statistically different are shown in *italics*.

Data from the Gallup Daily Tracking survey suggest that nearly 4% of adults identify as LGBT, implying that there are an estimated 9.5 million LGBT adults in the US (Gates 2014). Like the NHIS data, the Gallup data also show that about 60% of LGBT identified adults are not part of a married or unmarried couple.² If the NHIS figures regarding relationship status and child-rearing are applied to the Gallup estimate, it would mean that more than a million LGBT adults who are not in a couple are raising approximately 2 million children.

These calculations suggest that the estimated number of adults in the US who are raising children under age 18 and are either in a married or unmarried same-sex couple or are LGB-identified and not in a couple is between 862,000 and 1.26 million. The estimates for the number of children being raised either by a same-sex couple or a non-coupled LGB parent are between 1.3 and 2.2 million.

In considering the total extent of parenting among LGB adults, it is important to consider that some LGB parents are raising children as part of a different-sex couple. This is particularly true for bisexual parents. Among bisexual adults with children, 51% were married with a different-sex spouse, 11% had a different-sex unmarried partner, and 4% had a same-sex spouse or partner. Among adults who identified as gay or lesbian and were raising children, 18% had a different-sex married spouse and 4% had a different-sex unmarried partner.

Among all LGB-identified adults, regardless of relationship status, NHIS analyses suggest that an estimated 23% were raising children under age 18 (20% among lesbians and gay men and 31% among bisexual men and women). Applying that figure to the NHIS and Gallup estimates of the size of the LGB and LGBT populations, respectively, implies that between 1.2 and 2.2 million LGBT adults in the US are raising from 2.0 to 3.7 million children.³

Discussion

The 2013 NHIS data provide a rare opportunity to consider relationship and family status along with sexual orientation identity within the framework of a population-based survey. Many of the findings in

these analyses are consistent with other research. These similarities include estimates of the number of same-sex couples, the proportion of those couples who are raising children, and demographic patterns with regard to age, race/ethnicity, inter-racial and ethnic coupling, and educational attainment.

Because of challenges associated with the measurement of same-sex couples in US Census Bureau data, estimates of the number of married same-sex couples in the US or their geographic distribution are difficult to obtain. Such estimates are further complicated by a legal landscape where the availability of marriage for same-sex couples across states is changing rapidly, as well as likely rapid changes in the number and location of married same-sex couples.

The NHIS data confirm that married same-sex couples live throughout the country, including in many states where their marriages may not be recognized. More than one in ten (12%) reported living in the South, where only Maryland and Washington, DC recognized their marriages.

The estimate of approximately 124,000 married same-sex couples (or the 130,000 estimate derived by using only data from the second half of 2013) offers evidence of substantial change in the last few years.

As of 2010, Badgett and Herman (2011) estimated that about 50,000 same-sex couples had married in the US. A survey conducted in that same year by the Williams Institute suggested that the total number of married same-sex couples in that year (including couples married outside of the US) may have been as high as 80,000. Even under an assumption using the conservative estimate of 124,000 marriages, these figures suggest that the population of married same-sex couples in the US has grown by more than 50% in only three years.

In U.S., 10.2% of LGBT Adults Now Married to Same-Sex Spouse

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Two years after the Supreme Court ruled in *Obergefell v. Hodges* that states could not prohibit same-sex marriages, 10.2% of lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender (LGBT) adults in the U.S. are married to a same-sex spouse. That is up from

7.9% in the months prior to the Supreme Court decision in 2015, but only marginally higher than the 9.6% measured in the first year after the ruling.


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On June 26, 2015, the Supreme Court issued the *Obergefell* decision. As would be expected, the number of same-sex marriages has increased, though the rate of increase has slowed.

As the percentage of LGBT adults in same-sex marriages has increased over the past two years, the percentage in same-sex domestic partnerships has fallen sharply from 12.8% before the Supreme Court ruling to 6.6%.

About half of the decline in same-sex domestic partnerships can be explained by the increase in same-sex marriages. The rest of the decline could mean that others formerly in same-sex domestic partnerships may have stopped living together, or no longer consider a same-sex cohabitant as a "partner."

As a result of these shifts, Gallup estimates that 61% of same-sex, cohabiting couples in the U.S. are now married, up from 38% before the Supreme Court legalized same-sex marriage in June 2015, and 49% one year ago.



An increasing percentage of LGBT adults now identify their marital status as single or never married. That has always been the dominant status among LGBT individuals, but has increased from 47.4% to 55.7% over the last two years.

LGBT Americans are still more likely to be married to an opposite-sex spouse (13.1%) than a same-sex spouse (10.2%), but the gap is narrowing. According to prior research on LGBT identification, roughly half of those who self-identify as LGBT are bisexual,

helping explaining the high proportion of LGBT individuals who are married to oppositesex partners. Gallup's question does not probe specifically for whether LGBT individuals are lesbian or gay or bisexual or transgender.

The results are based on Gallup Daily tracking interviews since Jan. 28, 2015, when Gallup first asked lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender (LGBT) individuals who indicated they were married or living with a partner if their spouse or partner was the same sex or the opposite sex.

Overall, 4.3% of U.S. adults identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender, according to Gallup's latest estimate from its June 2016-June 2017 tracking data. That is up from 3.9% a year ago and 3.4% in Gallup's initial estimate in 2012.

Same-Sex Marriage More Common Among Men, Older LGBT Adults

Currently, 11.4% of LGBT men versus 9.3% of LGBT women say they are married to a same-sex partner. Also, the marriage rate among older LGBT adults is higher than it is among younger adults.

Notably, even older LGBT adults are most likely to identify their marital status as single -- 32% say they have never married. This indicates that many LGBT adults, even at older ages when marriage may be more feasible or desirable than it is for younger adults, are remaining single. By comparison, 11.3% of non-LGBT adults age 50 and older have never married.

Implications

Same-sex marriages are becoming increasingly common, and same-sex domestic partnerships less common, for LGBT Americans. In the first year after the Supreme Court ruled states could not prohibit same-sex marriages, the percentage of LGBT Americans who were married grew nearly two percentage points. In the second year since the ruling, the growth has continued, but at a diminished rate. This suggests an initial burst in the number of same-sex marriages came in response to the legal changes. Now, with those legal changes further in the past, the growth in same-sex marriages may be slower.

However, growth in the rate of same-sex marriages is likely to continue. Younger adults, many who may not be in a position to marry regardless of their sexual identity, are disproportionately likely to identify as LGBT. As they age, their life situations may change and they may want to get married. Also, as future generations of LGBT adults come of age, having grown up in a time when there were no legal restrictions on same-sex marriage and greatly reduced societal norms against it, they may marry at higher rates than LGBT Americans in generations before them.


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My Views on Gay Marriage

For posterity, below I've preserved the lengthy essay I composed years ago outlining my support for gay marriage. I'm happy to say that, thanks to the tireless efforts of countless, impassioned human rights activists and a narrow but decisive victory handed down by the Supreme Court, these words stand are now merely historical document about an ugly time in our national history.

Too long/don't feel like reading? I will cheerfully perform a wedding ceremony for any consenting adults, regardless of gender or sexual orientation. Read more or hit me up and I'll tell you all about how much your love matters!

I tend to overreact. Someone cuts me off in traffic. Do I give them a helpful gesture through the windshield? No. I'm plotting in my head the most expedient fashion by which to exterminate their entire bloodline from the

earth. McDonald's didn't give me a hash brown with my Egg McMuffin. Do I pull back around and wait in the drive-through? No. I drive my carthrough the front of the store, up to the front counter and demand service. The electric company reads my meter wrong and is threatening to send me to collections if I don't pay the extra \$25 on my last bill. Do I call customer service? No. I refuse to pay – in fact, I create an elaborate plan to have all of my cash and belongings brought to my home in the event of my death and have it all torched so that, not even when I die, can they collect the \$25 from the smoldering remains of my estate. So, actually, to say I overreact would be an understatement.

That's why I was so proud of myself for my near saint-like behavior a few years ago during a visit to my local apothecary. It was just after that year's election, and I was listening to a piece on NPR on the passage of Proposition 8, the ban on gay marriage in California. It put me in a foul mood. As I pulled into the parking lot and began looking for a place to park, what did mine eyes behold? A beautiful, gleaming Lexus quite unceremoniously double-parked right in front of the store entrance.

I parked my car, got out and examined the offending vehicle. You might have expected me to drag a key across the driver's door, or shoot out the tires, or concoct a diabolical scheme whereby an international courier towed the car to a barge and shipped it to Siberia, but I did none of these. I looked at the car, and I came to a truly profound realization. A calm came over me. I shopped and departed.

The prevalence of homosexuality behavior across the heterosexual-homosexual continuum is debatable, as is the number of men and women who identify themselves as having an exclusively homosexual orientation: Recent studies indicate a range between 2-7 percent of the population. Even using the conservative estimate on a planet of six billion souls, this represents 120 million people in the world, and approximately six million in the United States alone. This is a remarkably large minority having their fates decided by an often unsympathetic majority.

Traditional conservative (and in the West, predominantly Christian) ideology dictates that homosexuality is an affront to God and a sin; that it's a choice, and that gay people just aren't "putting their shoulder into it" when it comes to being straight; and that allowing gay couples to marry waters down the sanctity of the institution of marriage, thus invalidating "real" marriages between one man and one woman.

Meanwhile, the traditional liberal viewpoint emphasizes that if God created humanity, He placed homosexuality in it as part of the world and the natural order to which it adheres; that homosexuality exists in a natural, predetermined (and some would even argue, genetic) imperative in each

person; and that, as human beings, homosexuals ought to be afforded the same societal rights and privileges as anyone else, free of prejudice.

As one might guess, I wholeheartedly embrace the liberal viewpoint on homosexuality, and by extension, gay marriage. I believe that homosexuality, while not the norm, is still natural. I believe that gays have about as much ability to "decide" to be straight as I have to "decide" to be gay. And more than anything, I believe that we as a nation and as a species, decades or maybe centuries from now, will look back on our predecessors with the same awestruck shame as we do those who championed slavery. Some people believe God hates gays. I believe God hates hate.

Why is there so much intolerance and hate for the gay community? Why are there people who seek to codify bigotry (the Federal Marriage Amendment) into the highest law of our land? The question can be answered with one word: Ignorance. There are many in this country whose lives don't extend beyond the boundaries of their small towns. They are fed false information through media and entertainment and accept it as truth. They believe what the Rush Limbaughs, Bill O'Riellys and Billy Grahams of the world tell them: That homosexuality is a scourge, that they seek to undermine your marriage, recruit your children and usher in some age of decadence for which we'll all end up going to hell.

Liberal politics, and by extension, support for gay marriage thrives in large cities and college towns. Why? It's because education and experience are the enemies of bigotry. College campuses are regarded as hotbeds for liberals. Seattle, Baltimore, San Francisco, New Haven – these metropolitan areas are notorious liberal strongholds, and ones where you're much more likely to work, live next door to, or share your favorite watering hole with a gay person.

The resident of rural or small town America fears what he does not know or understand (gays). Meanwhile, residents of big cities (who can see and understand the gay community, and even know and are friends with gay people) have no fear, and therefore, no such bigotry exists.

The whole scenario reminds me of the short story, "Guests of the Nation," by Frank O'Connor. In the story, which takes place during the Irish War of Independence, two Irish Republican Army soldiers get to know and befriend two English prisoners in their care. Later, when ordered to execute the prisoners, their hearts and minds rebel. Why? Because, knowing their enemies – their hopes, fears, triumphs and tribulations, and discovering that they are, if nothing else, more alike than different – made it impossible to demonize them.

So, how do we solve this nationwide dilemma? We take a barometer of antigay sentiment in the nation, find the most egregious offenders and create something akin to a foreign exchange student program. The main difference: Instead of students, they're gay men and women. They pack their bags, bid their lives farewell for a year or so and shack up with a virulently antihomosexual family. But, in this exercise, the foreign visitor would not be the student – they would be the teacher. After a year of getting to know this gay person and being forced to put a human face on someone they would have otherwise merely labeled, maybe they would change. (This is a satirical suggestion, of course, but tell me it wouldn't work.)

Let's return to the parking lot at Walgreens for a moment. As I looked at that gorgeous car, parked so arrogantly and seemingly without regard for anyone else, a thought occurred to me: I don't know the person who this car belongs to. I know nothing about them. Perhaps it was just another obtuse, suit and tie-wearing, Lexus-driving, six figure-earning piece of alpha-male flotsam with no regard for the yellow lines that separates us from animals.

Or, perhaps it wasn't. Maybe it was a woman. Maybe she just finished up a year-long stint watching her five-year-old son die of some sort of rare cancer. And maybe she just came back from the funeral home after picking out his little casket. And maybe she had to stop at Walgreens to pick up her valium, in the hopes that something might offer her a moment's respite from the horrifying, soul-annihilating pain she's feeling, and couldn't see the yellow lines of the parking spaces through her tears.

Maybe that's who that Lexus belonged to. She doesn't deserve to have her car keyed. So I didn't do it.

I'm going to take a guess that most gay people in California voted against Proposition 8 – that is to say, they were in favor of gay marriage. And I'm going to guess that most people in California who could put a human face on the gay community because of a friend, loved one, coworker, or anyone else they're close to voted against it as well. And finally, I'm going to guess those that voted for it – who are against gay marriage – have had little or no meaningful contact with a gay person in their lives.

It's that last group of people – they're the ones keying the car. They don't even know the people they're victimizing and marginalizing. They just see the Lexus parked across two spaces, make an assumption and drag their key across. Would they have done it if they had known? If they could hear the stories and see the love between the people they were denying this privilege – would they still pull out their keys? If every person in this world had a son, daughter, brother, sister, mother, father or beloved friend that was gay – would they still do as they had done? I hope the answer is no – and I further hope that one day my hope becomes a certainty.

I know I've made a lot of broad generalizations here. There are conservatives who support gay marriage and liberals who take the staunch position that homosexuality is a grave sin. Some people are flat-out homophobic fascists, some people embrace every aspect of homosexuality and some people lie in between. The way I see the world is not necessarily the way things actually are in the world. But the way I first saw that Lexus is not necessarily the way things are, either.

All that being said ... while the United States Supreme Court did strike down California's ban on gay marriage as unconstitutional, the fight for marriage equality in Ohio is still a work in progress. But while that fight continues, I offer up the following suggestion to gay couples who long for the right to marry: Pay the state no mind.

A marriage has nothing to do with laws, ballot measures, voters, judges or churches. It has nothing to do with papers filed in the dusty basements of courthouses, tax breaks or, paradoxically, even the wedding ceremony that's its genesis. It has everything to do with the vows that two people make to one another.

A marriage, no matter who approves of it, sanctions it or recognizes it, is merely a pair of mutual promises. No law prohibits it, and even the ugliest of bigotry can never negate it. No law, government or a single individual can stand in the way of two people from committing their love and their lives to each other.

Don't put your dreams on the back burner while you wait for the rest of the world to catch up. The day will come when you'll be married on paper – get married in real life whenever you want.

Q: How much will you charge to perform our wedding?

A: Arrangements with me are based on the location and details of your wedding, and I'm happy to work with your budget concerns. (I don't want to turn anyone away!) I'd be glad to discuss these details with you at your free, inperson wedding consultation, and I have many references can give you upon request. (click here to read wedding client reviews)

<u>Q: Do you require a deposit to book our wedding?</u>

A: A deposits will secure wedding date with me. You may put down a deposit when you make arrangements for me to perform your wedding, and then pay the balance the day of your wedding, or in installments, so to break up the cost into more than one payment. I can also accept credit cards via Paypal or Square.



I am happy to provide a copy of my credentials to you upon request. I am legally ordained through the Universal Ministries, and am licensed to solemnize marriages from the Secretary of State in Ohio. You are also welcome to compare them with the minister's database which is kept by our government and gives you the opportunity to verify the credentials of any ordained minister who is legally licensed to solemnize marriages. Q: What will you wear when you perform our wedding ceremony?

You will both need to go together, and will both need your drivers license or State issued picture ID. If either of you have been married in the past, you will need to bring proof that the marriage has legally ended by divorce or death. If between the ages of 18 and 21, you'll also need a copy of your birth certificate. If between the ages of 16 and 18, parental consent is required.

In Ohio there is no waiting period to receive your marriage license, and no blood tests are required. Average cost of a marriage license runs between \$45, though some counties charge more. For more information regarding marriage licenses in Ohio, click here. For a list of phone numbers and addresses for Ohio county clerk of courts, click here. For all other states, click here.

For couples who wish to solemnize their vows, but who do not wish to apply for a State-issued marriage license, I am happy to provide you with a lovely Certificate of Marriage that allows you to record and display the date you took your vows on a decorative document.

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

Do you perform gay weddings?

Absolutely. I've been preforming LGBTQ weddings since before they were legal. I even had the honor of performing the first ever gay wedding at the Statehouse (May 13th, 2017) I am well versed with the nuances which accompany a same sex wedding or gender non-binary wedding. But like with everything else I do, I am happy to celebrate love in all of its forms.

How did you get started?

My adventure in officiating actually started at my own wedding. My wife and I were on the hunt to something a little different with our ceremony, but we were unable to find someone who would perform what we wanted. Everyone we talked to said something to the effect of "That's not what a wedding is supposed to be."I balked at that idea, so I wrote my own wedding and had a friend perform it. We had so much fun that night that, as my friends started getting married, they began asking me to write and perform their ceremonies. Since then it has become a passion as much as it has a career.

The quick answer is: not usually. I'll stick around for part of cocktail hour to take care of the paperwork and maybe eat a cheese cube or two, but I typically make a quiet exit before the introductions. Weddings are expensive enough and I don't like burdening my couples by asking them to feed me. If it is the case that a couple really wants me to stay, I will attempt to make that happen. Sometimes I've got other weddings to get to and sometimes I've got dad-duties at home, but I'll do what I can to hang out for a bit.

Do you stay for the rehearsal dinner?

Like with wedding receptions, the answer is generally no. However, there are 2 schools of thought here. My perspective has always been that rehearsal dinners are a family affair; a chance for the two families to spend some time together and get to know each other in a new intimate way before the wedding. So out of respect, I opt not to attend as I would not want to invade. The other school of thought, which I was introduced to in 2018, is that I am performing an important or intimate service and it may be the case that members of the family want to get to know me a little bit before I do that. If your family happens to be of the 2nd variety, I will once again do what I can to attend.

Will you wear a costume or cosplay?

Yes, yes, and thrice times a yes. Did I mention I love celebrating people in all of the ways that bring them joy? This just adds to the fun. My closet is large and I have a number of costume/outfits to choose from, but I'm up for most challenges. However, if I don't own it and it is the case that you can't provide it, then the cost would fall on you. I have a number of sources from which to obtain new costumes, so I can help hunt it down if you need.

Will you perform a ceremony at a correctional facility?

Yes, but know that I charge \$50.00 extra for the background check required to enter and perform at any given correctional institution. Know also that most of these facilities are a fair distance from my home, so a travel fee would be incurred as well.

Are you Religious?

Strictly speaking, I am not religious, but I am a scholar of religions across the world. Human belief systems have always fascinated me. I recognize some spiritual philosophies within myself, but I am a pretty staunch atheist. However I never let my own beliefs (or lack thereof) interfere with the needs of my couples.

"The years that Marie and Leslie have spent in a loving, committed relationship is quite an accomplishment in today's world. They first met in 1974. It was the heyday of the Women's Movement, and Marie and Leslie each found herself drawn to the Gay Women's Alternative, which met in the basement of the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship on Central Park West in Manhattan. G.W.A.- or, as Marie called it, "Gwaaa" – was a place where women could meet, listen to a broad range of speakers from the arts and public affairs, including, among others, Bella Abzug and Gloria Steinem, and then talk, nosh, and connect with one another on more than the superficial level that the clubs offered. Both they and the world have changed since then. It has been quite a journey, but what hasn't changed is the way they love and care for one another. Although, like all couples they do disagree on occasion, their love and respect for one another are ever present. Through wonderful and difficult times their support for one another has never wavered. Marie and Leslie have two different approaches to life. They describe it as being similar to the way they speak. Marie speaks like graffiti, bold and colorful, right out there, and Leslie speaks clearly and concisely in fully formed paragraphs. Together, they are simply better than either could be alone.

Marie wrote a little about what this day means to them and Leslie said "ditto" so I would like to share those words with you now.

For us, this ceremony is a way of acknowledging and celebrating our partnership of 37 plus years. Tonight, it will be, to be precise, 37 years, 6 months, and 7 days.

It hasn't always been easy for either of us. We come from different worlds. Leslie grew up in the heart of America, Tulsa, Oklahoma. Her family tended, most of the time, to be quiet, polite, and they didn't interrupt each other. I grew up in Queens, New York, as a member of a large, loud and extended Italian family, in which it was normal for everyone to talk at the same time – in two languages – and to interrupt each other as a matter of course. Often times in an excitable and operatic manner.

Our unlikely partnership has enriched us both in many ways – literally and figuratively. But what we most value in our years of living together is that they have enabled us, in our mixed attempts, to become better human beings. And, we can't think of anything that matters more to us – God or no God – than that. It's fair to say that we've helped each other grow.

And finally, for whatever time we have left, each of us wants to spend it with the other.

Which is another way of saying: "I do."





When the three of us sat down to talk about this wedding I asked them why they were going to another state to get married if it has no legal meaning in Indiana. Groom explained that he has always considered New York to be a second home, spending summers for the past 30 years at the family vacation home in the Adirondack Mountains, both parents born in NY, and family who still live in NY. However, what stands out to me most about our conversation was that this is not a commitment ceremony. It is a marriage. They are not seeking to become partners in life they are becoming one as husband and husband. I don't know about you, but I find this profound.

When I asked about parents I was surprised to hear all the parents would be here tonight. That is not as common as you may think. Be it a gay or straight marriage. But Groom and Groom explained that they were raised in an open, loving, environments. Both sets of parents have been together since they first married. Groom and Groom have seen first hand what long and lasting love and commitment truly mean!

The Grooms said they would like to include some readings from civil rights and gay rights history that are important to them. One reading comes to mind almost instantly. That is the decision given by Massachusetts Supreme Court Chief Justice Margaret H. Marshall which ushered in a new era in 2004 when that State became the first in this country to legalize same-sex marriage. It truly speaks to what is important to these two men:

"Marriage is a vital social institution. The exclusive commitment of two individuals to each other nurtures love and support; it brings stability to our society. For those who choose to marry, and for their children, marriage provides an abundance of legal, financial, and social benefits. In return it imposes weighty legal, financial, and social obligations....Without question, civil marriage enhances the "welfare of the community." It is a "social institution of the importance." ... Marriage highest bestows enormous private and advantages on those who choose to marry. Civil marriage is at once a deeply personal commitment to another human being and a

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institution, and the decision whether and whom to marry is among life's momentous acts of self-definition."
