Dear Mr. Cayce:

We write in response to appellants' January 27, 2021 letters pursuant to Federal Appellate Rule 28(j).

As the government explained in its brief, plaintiffs obtained a favorable final judgment on their RFRA claims against the 2016 Rule, which HHS did not appeal, and the challenged provisions of that Rule were vacated and rescinded. Under those circumstances, plaintiffs' request for injunctive relief against the 2016 Rule is moot, and they cannot obtain relief against a possibility of future agency action that is not imminent and the contours of which are yet to be known.

The developments that plaintiffs cite in their letter only confirm that point. Unlike the plaintiffs in this case, the plaintiffs in *Religious Sisters of Mercy v. Azar*, 2021 WL 191009 (D.N.D. Jan. 19, 2021), did not have a favorable judgment on RFRA claims against the 2016 Rule, and in any event the government is currently evaluating whether to appeal the injunction issued in that case. Moreover, Executive Order No. 13,988 directs agencies to "consider whether to"

take any actions “necessary to fully implement statutes that prohibit sex discrimination” and “consistent with applicable law” (which includes RFRA). 86 Fed. Reg. 7,023, 7,024 (Jan. 20, 2021). Plaintiffs’ reliance on that order before HHS has taken any action only highlights the speculative and premature nature of their request for injunctive relief.
