ORDER GRANTING JOINT MOTION TO STAY DEADLINES

This matter comes before the Court on a joint Motion by Defendant Jason Haught, in his official capacity as Director of the West Virginia Public Employees Insurance Agency (“Defendant”), by and through counsel, Perry W. Oxley, David E. Rich, Eric D. Salyers, Christopher K. Weed, and the law firm of Oxley Rich Sammons, PLLC, along with Plaintiff, Leanne James, by and through counsel, to stay the deadlines in the Scheduling Order with respect to the claims of Plaintiff James against Defendant Haught. For good cause shown, the Court stays the fact discovery deadline for Defendant Haught and Plaintiff James until a ruling occurs on the Motion for Leave to File the Second Amended Complaint.

If the Motion for Leave is granted, Defendant Haught, Plaintiff James, PEIA, and Kanawha County Board of Education shall conduct a new Rule 26(f) conference so that the parties can propose a new revised case schedule with a new fact discovery cut-off for Defendant Haught, Defendant PEIA, and Ms. James, and all other relevant deadlines for Defendant Kanawha County Board of Education.

If the Motion for Leave is denied, Defendant Haught and Ms. James will submit a joint status report to the Court within seven days of the ruling proposing a plan for the completion of discovery.
