Scheduling Order

On June 7, 2022, the Court held oral argument on Plaintiff’s pending Motion to Compel and conducted a status conference. (Doc. 160.) Although the Motion to Compel remains pending and will be resolved in a forthcoming Order, the parties asked the court to schedule a four-day bench trial in this case for March 2023. (*Id.* at 44:9–49:23.) To accommodate a March 2023 trial date, the court finds it appropriate to set further deadlines. Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED:

A. The parties shall disclose their responsive expert reports on or before **July 22, 2022**; the parties shall disclose their reply expert reports on or before **August 12, 2022**.

B. All **discovery**, including final supplementation of discovery responses, answers to interrogatories, production of documents, depositions, and requests for admissions, must be completed by **Friday, September 23, 2022**.

C. **Dispositive motions** shall be filed on or before **Friday, October 21, 2022**.

1 Pursuant to LRCiv 7.2, counsel may file a motion, response, and reply. **No time extensions**
2 **will be granted.** All pleadings submitted for the Court's review and decision must comply
3 with the filing, time, and form requirements of the Local Rules. *See* LRCiv 12.1, 56.1.
4 Additionally, any pleading which is submitted with more than one exhibit must be
5 accompanied by a Table of Contents. The exhibits must be indexed with tabs which
6 correspond to the Table of Contents. Absent exigent circumstances, the Court will not
7 consider pleadings which do not conform to these requirements.

8 A party filing a dispositive motion shall file only one dispositive motion which
9 incorporates all relevant arguments. The dispositive motion shall be limited to 17 pages as
10 required by LRCiv 7.2(e); responses are limited to 17 pages and replies are limited to 11
11 pages. *See* LRCiv 7.2(e). The parties are prohibited from simultaneously filing multiple
12 dispositive motions directed at separate counts or issues in a case. The parties should raise
13 all their arguments for dismissal in one motion for summary judgment. If necessary, the
14 parties may seek leave to exceed page limits to include all their arguments in one motion
15 to dismiss or one motion for summary judgment.

16 A motion for summary judgment must comply with LRCiv 56.1. In addition, any
17 fact in a statement of facts or controverting statement of facts must be in the motion for
18 summary judgment or response. Extraneous facts not discussed or referenced in the motion
19 for summary judgment/response should not appear in the statement of facts or
20 controverting statement of facts. Each fact in a statement of facts or controverting
21 statement of facts must include a specific pin cite to the admissible portion of the record
22 where the fact finds support. Generalized cites to a deposition or exhibit are not acceptable.
23 The Court will rely solely upon the attached evidence to verify facts asserted in the motion,
24 response, or reply as identified by a pin cite. Exhibits attached to the statement of
25 facts/controverting statement of facts shall include only relevant excerpts rather than full
26 documents. No evidence may be submitted with a reply.

27 D. Counsel shall file a proposed **Joint Proposed Pretrial Order** on or before
28 **Wednesday, January 25, 2023**, unless dispositive motions are filed. If dispositive motions

1 are filed, the Joint Proposed Pretrial Order shall be filed 30 days after the filing date of the
2 Court's order on the dispositive motions.


3 E. The **Pretrial Conference** will be set upon the filing of the Joint Proposed
4 Pretrial Order. **A bench trial is set for March 7, 2023 at 9:30 A.M. through March 13,**
5 **2023.**

6 F. Counsel cannot, without the Court's approval, extend the deadlines imposed
7 by the Court. All motions and requests for extension of time shall comply with LRCiv 7.3.
8 All motions and requests for extension of discovery deadlines must include a summary of
9 the discovery conducted to date, the anticipated discovery to be done if the request is
10 granted, and the reasons why discovery has not been completed within the deadline.

11 G. All motions, responses and replies must comply with LRCiv 7.2(e). **All**
12 **requests for page extensions must be filed at least one week prior to the filing of the**
13 **substantive document**, must note how many prior extensions have been requested, and
14 must state the position of all parties. Any page extension requests filed within one week of
15 the substantive document may be denied.
