ORDER

Before: McKEOWN and GOULD, Circuit Judges, and LASNIK,* District Judge.

Defendants-Appellants’ motions to continue the stay of appellate proceedings are DENIED, and Plaintiff-Appellee’s motions to lift the stay are GRANTED. The Clerk shall lift the stay over the appellate proceedings as to Defendants-Appellants Idaho Department of Correction; Henry Atencio; Jeff

Zumda; Howard Keith Yordy; Richard Craig; Rona Siegert; and Scott Eliason. Per the bankruptcy court's order, the Clerk shall continue the stay of the appeal as to Corizon, Inc. pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 362(a).

The parties are ordered to submit briefs addressing whether the district court erred in its decision granting in part and denying in part Plaintiff-Appellee's motion for attorneys' fees and costs. The opening brief from Defendants-Appellants shall be submitted within 28 days from the date of entry of this order and shall not exceed 10,000 words. The answering brief from Plaintiff-Appellee shall be filed within 14 days of the Defendant-Appellant's opening brief and shall not exceed 10,000 words. A reply is not required but may be filed within 7 days of the answer and shall not exceed 3,000 words.

Parties who are registered for Appellate ECF must file briefs electronically. Parties who are not registered Appellate ECF filers must file the original brief plus seven paper copies.

Oral argument on the attorneys' fees and costs issue shall take place at 10:00 am on Tuesday, March 5, 2024, in Seattle, Washington.
